Stouffville player banged up in pro hockey bus crash

Albany River Rats skid off Massachusetts highway

Stouffville's Bobby Hughes was a bit bruised, but not seriously injured.

That was the prognosis given by his mother Heidi, who talked with her son early Thursday morning after hearing the bus carrying the Albany River Rats' American Hockey League team was involved in an accident in Becket, Mass.

Returning to Albany after playing in Lowell, Mass., the bus struck a guard rail and rolled on its side on Interstate 90 in western Massachusetts.

POSSIBLE CONCUSSION

Three members of the River Rats were seriously injured after the bus rolled on its side at around 3:35 a.m. Thursday, police reports said.


Hughes, a 21-year-old Stouffville resident and forward with the River Rats, was not among the seriously hurt.

"Bobby was a little banged up," Mrs. Hughes said. "He might have a concussion and some scrapes and bruises and a bump on his head. But he said he's OK.

"Fortunately, there were no fatalities. Count that as a blessing." Heidi did not know if her son would miss

any games with the injuries he sustained.

Police reports said the accident is under

investigation. But they said slippery roads caused by overnight snow might have been a factor.

Both lanes of the highway were closed following the single-vehicle accident.

RETURNED FROM SPORTS HERNIA

A fourth-round draft pick of the Carolina Hurricanes in the 2006 NHL draft, Hughes has two goals and one assist in 11 games this season with the River Rats.

Hughes didn't play for Albany from Nov. 8 to Feb. 13 because of a sports hernia.

The River Rats lost 3-2 in a shootout to the Lowell Devils Wednesday.
