# Radio station in tune with council money

WhiStle Radio wanted \$10,000 from Whitchurch-Stouffville to help keep the station on the air, but it will have to make due with \$2,500.

The donation was approved by council during its 2009 budget deliberations earlier this month.

#### REQUESTED \$10,000

"Ten thousand dollars is a little more than we can handle in this day and age," said Whitchurch-Stouffville Mayor Wayne Emmerson. "(The \$2,500 is) only a one-time shot to save you."

Halvord Moorshead, one of the Main Street radio station's directors, said he hopes that by receiving this unofficial stamp of approval from council, more people and companies will jump on board and provide their support.

"The council donation is much more valuable than the sum; it's almost like a catalyst," he said.

The town's donation will be used to create professional advertising kits.

Late last year, WhiStle first approached council seeking financial assistance because "we have to scramble just to meet our very minimal bills," Mr. Moorshead said at the time.

drives and a more aggressive campaign to solicit advertisers, the station is now managing to keep itself afloat.

"We are considerably better financially off," Mr. Moorshead said. "There is no question of our survival."

On March 17, the station will be celebrating its first year on the air.

"We're really rather proud of what we've achieved," Mr. Moorshead said, noting the station produces more than 32 hours a week of original content.

"People, locally, are willing to help us by being on the air," he said of all the local artists, politicians and regular folk who have been interviewed by the program hosts.

#### LIVE MORNING SHOW

While the second year of operation will find the station focusing on increasing its number of members and advertising revenue, it also wants to expand its programming, including a live morning show, complete with news, weather and traffic reports.

"We're not ready to do that yet," Mr. Moorshead said, adding more volunteers are required. "(But) I'd be surprised if we couldn't introduce that this year."

### \$100,000 in grants, donations to festival, sports, arts groups

Whitchurch-Stouffville council approved almost \$100,000 in grants and donations in its 2009 budget.

The bulk of the funding - \$79,000 - went to services that require municipal funding in order to remain in operation, such as the cemetery, Strawberry Festival and Kinsmen Club.

The remainder of the funding was dished out to organizations outside of town departments. Last year, the municipality handed over about \$25,000 to a variety of groups. This year, that portion of the budget was set at \$20,000, however only \$12,090 has been allocated.


