According to Farmers' Market Ontario, 60 to 70 per cent of market-goers visit neighbouring businesses on their way to and from the market.

Markham, Newmarket and
Uxbridge all run successful

one last summer.

"A lot of shops would want to stay open if there were foot traffic," Ms LeBlanc noted. "I think they would embrace it."

A downtown farmers' market was held for

one day only about six years ago, at the clock tower, according to Ms LeBlanc, who said "it was pretty good."


However, Stouffville doesn't have to look far for examples of successful downtown farmers' markets.


