

Local artists make grade for Latcham's juried show

Latcham Gallery's annual juried exhibition has three Whitchurch-Stouffville artists showing their talents this year: Jacquelin Heichert, James Jennings and Margo Pienkowski.

Artists from across Ontario were invited to submit two recent pieces of work to be considered by a jury. The jurors were art writer and critic Betty Ann Jordon, artist and curator of the Cambridge Galleries Ivan Jurakic, and Lee Petrie, who is the curator for the Greater Toronto Airport Authority.

More than 200 submissions were received.

"At the end of the process, they had selected works in a range of media that they felt display clarity, technical expertise and reveal a sense of resolution throughout the entire piece," said Maura Broadhurst, curator of the gallery.

There is one award the public is allowed to choose:the People's Choice Award.

In celebration of the juried exhibition, today the gallery will be holding the event's opening reception from 2 to 4 p.m. The jurors' awards will be presented.

On March 26, juror Lee Petrie will be leading a discussion on the .juried process and commenting on his experience as a juror, as well as the curator of the GTAA. A \$5 donation is being requested. The discussion starts at 7:30 p.m.

On April 4, from 2 to 4 p.m., local artists are invited to perform a piece of music that was inspired by the exhibited art.
