Although no one is sure who started the society or what its initial purpose was, they do know the Stouffville Horticulture Society held a meeting on April 11, 1924, and since then the group has remained active.

tiple. It is to help the town, learn and share plants and information," Mrs. Ward said.

The group maintains the town-owned gardens in front of the Care and Share on Main Street, as well as the gardens at the Whitchurch-Stouffville library.

On Saturday, May 2, the society will hold a social tea at Parkview Home to celebrate its anniversary. The event takes place from 2 to 4 p.m. and is free.


