

Ice cream, checks dished out for firefighters' memorial

NHLers expected at Stouffville ball hockey event

Whitchurch-Stouffville firefighters will be scooping out your favourite ice cream and playing 3-on-3 ball hockey to help raise money for a permanent, national memorial to honour Canadian firefighters who have died in the line of duty.

"Although other Canadian service groups have been recognized nationally, the nearly 1,000 Canadian firefighters killed in the line of duty serving their communities have not," said Robert Kirkpatrick, president of the Canadian Fallen Firefighters Foundation.

The Canadian Fallen Firefighters Foundation and Baskin Robbins have teamed up for 31 Cent Scoop Night, which takes place Wednesday, April 29.

A junior scoop of any one of the chain's 31 flavours, or a soft serve cone, will be 31 cents, plus tax. The Stouffville store, at 5892 Main St., is taking part.

The other event being held in Stouffville to raise money for the foundation is the inaugural Summer Slap Shot 3-on-3 ball hockey

tournament May 9 at Boston Pizza, Hoover Park Drive and Hwy. 48. Action starts at 9 a.m. Whitchurch-Stouffville Professional Fire Fighters Association Local 4152 wanted to assist with the fundraising efforts as best they could.

John Winters, Chris Leonard and Jeff Bignell came up with the idea of a ball hockey tournament to raise money for the memorial.

Stouffville Boston Pizza owners Keith and Susan Acton agreed to help, donating 10 per cent of their proceeds during the tournament to Muscular Dystrophy Canada.

"The only downside we see with having Keith (Acton) involved is that he plans on putting a team of past and present NHLers together to win the tournament," Mr. Leonard said.

Mr. Acton, an assistant coach with the Toronto Maple Leafs, played more than 1,000 games in the NHL.

Teams are expected from firefighter associations from across the Golden Horseshoe, York Regional Police and York EMS.

On hand that day will also be the Toronto Maple Leafs' Mobile Fan Zone, which is a replica of the Leafs' dressing room for everyone to check out, along with face painting, a magician and jumping castle.
