**Swine flu patient
moved to Toronto**

A York Region woman who was hospitalized with swine flu at the Markham Stouffville Hospital has been moved to a Toronto hospital, officials at York Region Public Health said yesterday.

Dr. Karim Kurji, medical officer of health for the region, said a 38-year-old woman who tested positive for H1N1 flu was hospitalized at MSH about 11 days ago and that she required critical care attention.

The woman, he added, had no underlying medical conditions.

"The individual's sta-

tus is stable, but is still hospitalized," Dr. Kurji said. "She was moved to a Toronto hospital a few days ago...she still requires a very high level of attention."

As of yesterday, York Region had 126 confirmed cases of swine flu. So far, Dr. Kurji said only two individuals, including the above-mentioned woman, have been hospitalized; the other individual was a child, who was subsequently discharged.

Dr. Kurji said the virus is being spread from person to person among people with no direct link to Mexico, and that most cases are considered mild.

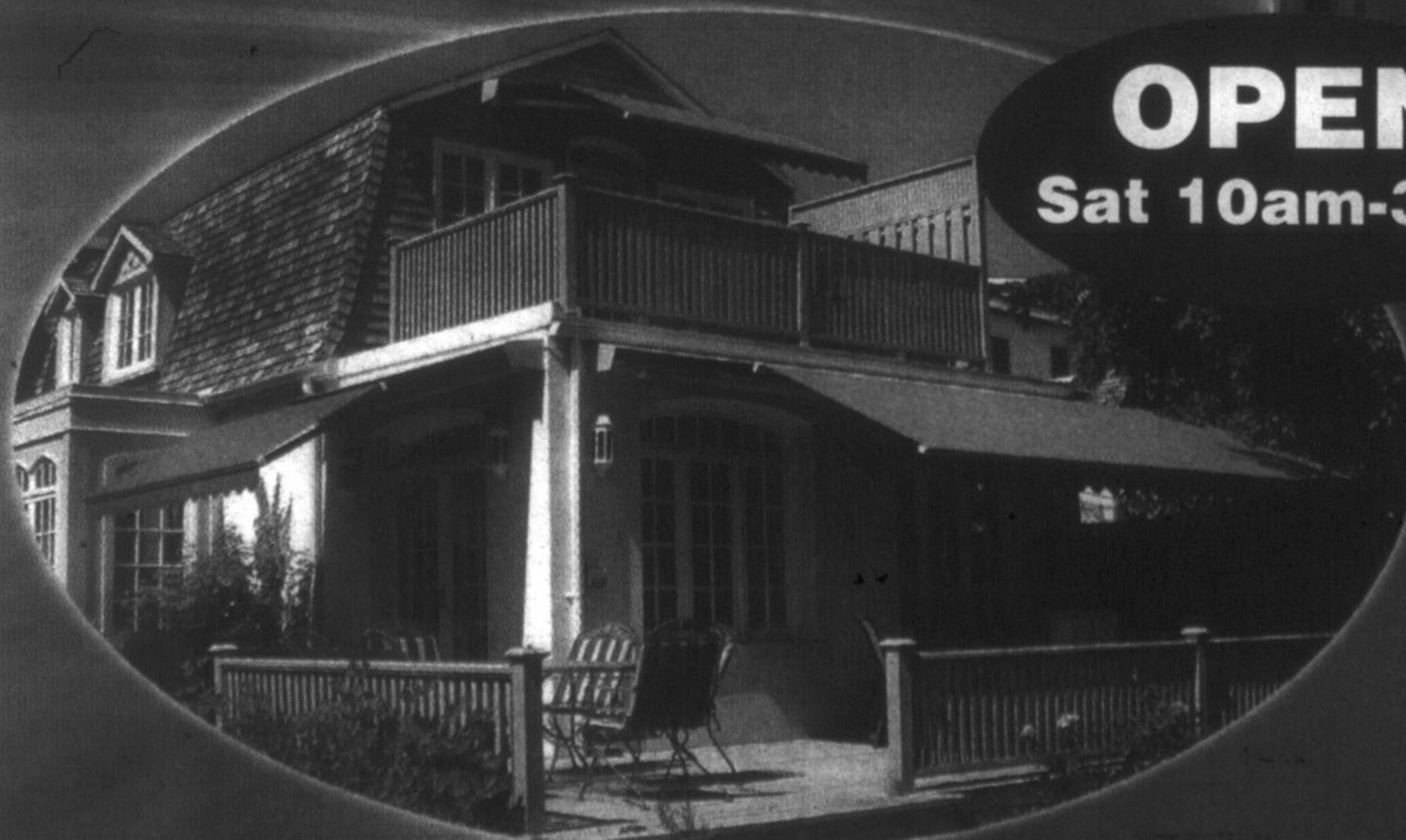
