

The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville is undertaking a study of the Phase 2 Development Lands within the Community of Stouffville Secondary Plan. The Phase 2 Development Area represents the next area of planned development in the Community of Stouffville. The purpose of the study is to:

The workshop will be led by the study consultants and will involve:


- A presentation by the consultants with respect to the purpose of the study and study process, including additional opportunities for input;
