Kay golden in international softball finals

Robert Kay was a member of Team Ontario that captured the 2009 Under-19 Men's International Softball Championship in Charlottetown, P.E.I.

The tourney culminated with a pair of victories over Saskatchewan 3-2 and 5-1 in last Sunday's double knockout format.

Employed primarily as a catcher and third baseman, Kay, 17, had one hit and one RBI in each of those contests.

During the 13-team tournament, Kay compiled a batting average of .438 that included eight hits and five RBIs. He also had an 82-per-cent fielding percentage.

He was also named Player of the Game for Team Ontario in their 5-1 victory over Team USA July 9.

During the tournament, Team Ontario lost just one game. That came against Saskatchewan during pool play.

Travis Connor, another Stouffville resident, also took part in the tournament and played for Team Northwest Territories.

Connor handled pitching and outfielding duties for Team Northwest Territories, which won four games and lost four.

While at the plate, the Stouffville District Secondary School student had a .417 batting average with 10

hits and an 82-per-cent fielding percentage.

Wilkinson to under-18 national hockey camp

Dayle Wilkinson was among 42 players invited by Hockey Canada to the National Women's Under-18 Team selection camp.

The 17-year-old Stouffville resident who played on defence this past season with the Toronto Junior Aeros will attend the camp from July 23 to 30 at Father David Bauer Olympic Arena in Calgary.

The players chosen will be divided into two teams and will take part in practices and intra-squad games.

From the selection camp, Hockey Canada will choose 22 players to represent Team Canada in a three-game series against the United States' Women's Under-18 Select Team in Calgary Aug. 24, 25 and 27.

Following the three-game series, Hockey Canada's regional scouts, along with the under-18 coaching staff, will evaluate players at the 2009 National Women's Under-18 Championship and with

their club teams, with the goal of selecting a team for the 2010 International Ice Hockey Federation World Women's Under-18 Championship that runs from March 27 to April 3 in the United States.

Wilkinson earned a berth to the selection camp based in part on her participation in the National Women's Under-18 Team strength and conditioning/skating camp during May in Calgary.

Bourgeois to jr. nationals

Michael Bourgeois was the youngest competitor in the 2,000-metre steeplechase event at the Canadian Legion Ontario Championships in Hamilton Friday.

But that did not stop the 15-year-old Stouffville resident from finishing third in a time of 6:30.77.

Based on his clocking, Bourgeois met the time standard to compete in the Youth and Junior National Championships. The Junior (under 20) Championships will take place this weekend in Charlottetown, P.E.I.

The Youth (under 17) Championships will be held in Sherbrooke, Que., Aug. 5 to 11.

The Stouffville District Secondary School student also ran the 3,000m and finished 10th in 9:34.

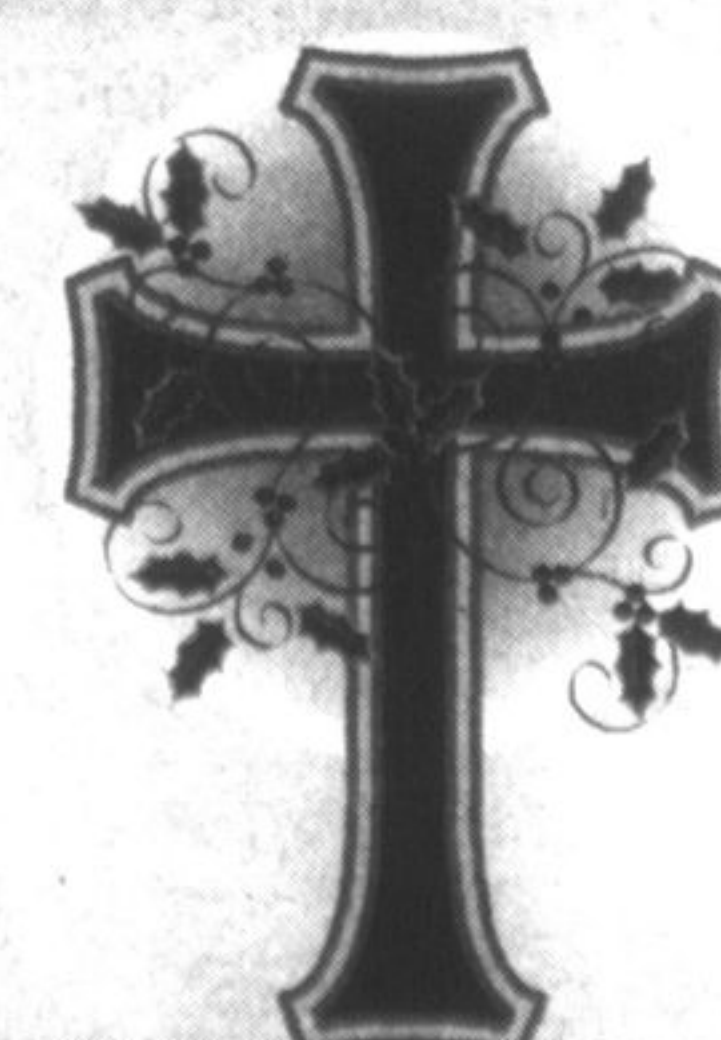
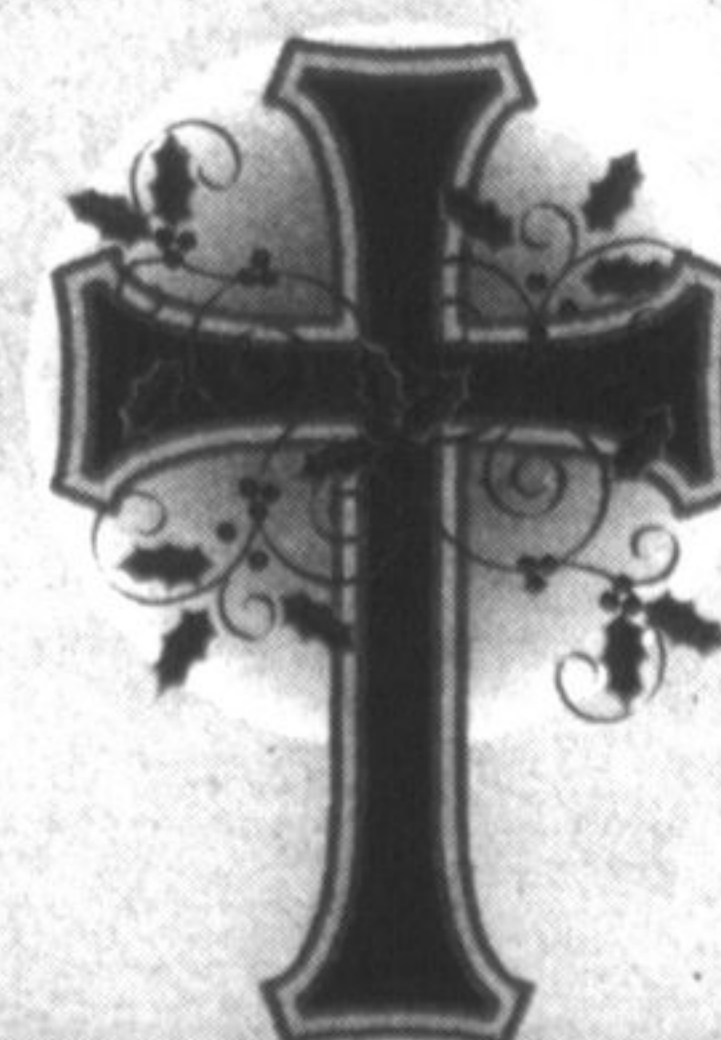
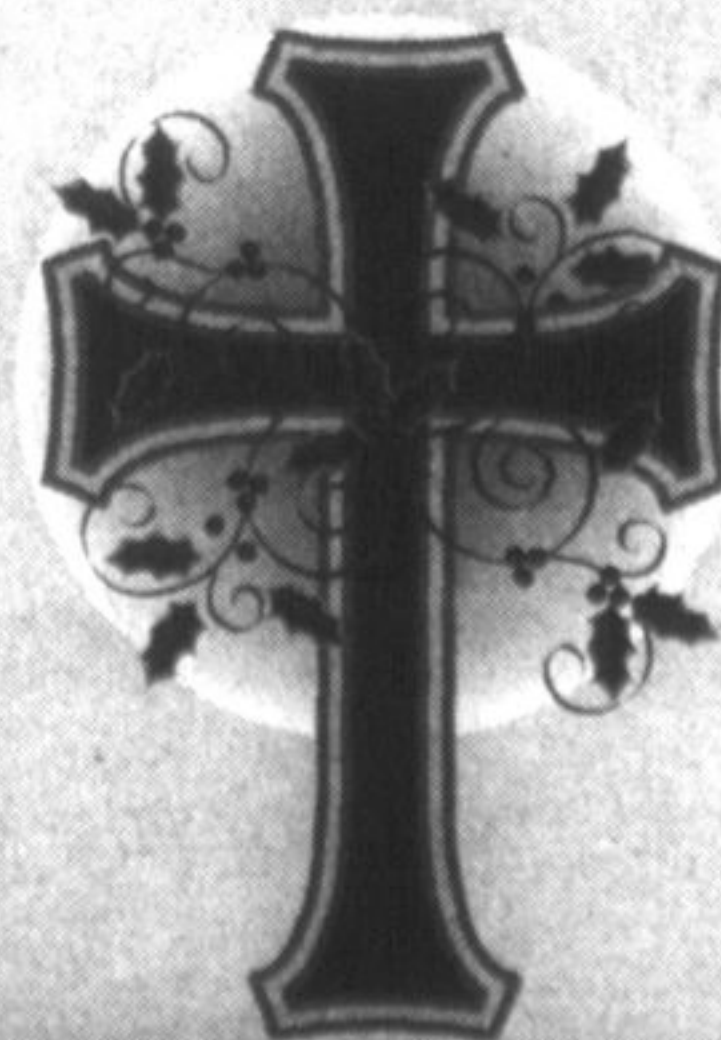
