




PEOPLE: Corey McCusker talks to people, dogs

Speaker motivated by mom to write chapter for book

Stouffville's Corey McCusker never backs down from new experiences or challenges.

So, when the motivational speaker and canine obedience instructor was asked to contribute to a book about female empowerment, she jumped at the chance.

She then had to take a step back to figure out how a non-writer was going to pen an entire chapter for a book that was this important to her and other women.

Ms McCusker took the opportunity to use some of the advice she imparts onto her clients on a daily basis, in particular: "if you believe in yourself and want something, I believe you can get it."

So with that, she wrote the sixth chapter - Put Your Mind To It, for the book entitled *The Power of Women United*.

The book was conceived by Lia Bandola and Tina Dezsi, who, in

2004 created the Power of Women Exchange, which provides an opportunity for female entrepreneurs, executives and professionals to support each other in business and life.

Ms McCusker joined the organization a few years ago because "my number one goal in life is to help people."

In her chapter, McCusker revealed how her mother, who raised two children on her own, never let anything stand in her way of what she wanted, specifically a career in the male-dominated world of banking.

"She always exuded confidence; she believed she could do anything," Ms McCusker said, noting her mother was one of the first women in Canada selected to the bank's management program.

Ms McCusker followed her mother into the financial world, but left after 21 years to start not one, but two companies - one as a private coach for people and the other as a dog obedience instructor.

"I had always been managing and mentoring people; I loved my career, but I wanted more," she said. "I believed I could do it all."
