

Council adding deep fryer to new rinks

You can have fries with that

The sweet smells of sweaty hockey gear and greasy french fries will fill Stouffville's new arena, despite the omission of a deep fryer from the original concession stand design.

"Mr. (Tom) Graham thought it wasn't a necessity," said Mayor Wayne Emmerson of the town's former director of leisure services, who spearheaded the project's original design.

features have to be installed, which will cost \$80,000.

The cost would have been the same, whether it was included in the original design or not, according to Mr. Emmerson.

"Based on the present budget projections for the project, there are sufficient funds available under the cash allowances to pay for the modification to the concession stand," Rob Raycroft, director of leisure services for Whitchurch-Stouffville wrote in his report to council.

"I think it will give the concession stand an opportunity to survive in this economy," Mr. Emmerson said.

The twin-pad arena, located between No Frills and Stouffville District Secondary School, is expected to open in early 2010.
