## Staff asks town to resolve issues regarding Hwy. 48

Provincial ministry stalling: officials

Municipal staff have had enough with the Ministry of Transportation's stalling tactics and have requested Whitchurch-Stouffville council step in to help resolve some outstanding issues associated with portions of Hwy. 48.

"We're bumping up against provincial policies that are affecting the way we do business in Whitchurch-Stouffville," said Andrew McNeely, director of planning and building services for the municipality.

There are four key issues the town's staff are having problems with, one of which is the speed along Hwy. 48 within Ballantrae and Stouffville.


Municipal staff want the speed limit along Hwy. 48 from 150 metres north of Ballantrae Road/Ballantrae Common through to the 60 km/h zone south of Greenan Road to all be 60 km/h.

The requested speed decrease is being made because of the traffic signals installed at Hwy. 48 and Ballantrae Road about a year ago and because of Ballantrae's everincreasing population.

"The reduction in the posted speed limit to 60 km/h in the northern portion of Ballantrae is necessary and overdue because of the population of the community.

"It has been a very frustrating process trying to move ahead with our initiatives in the Ballantrae area," said Councillor Phil
