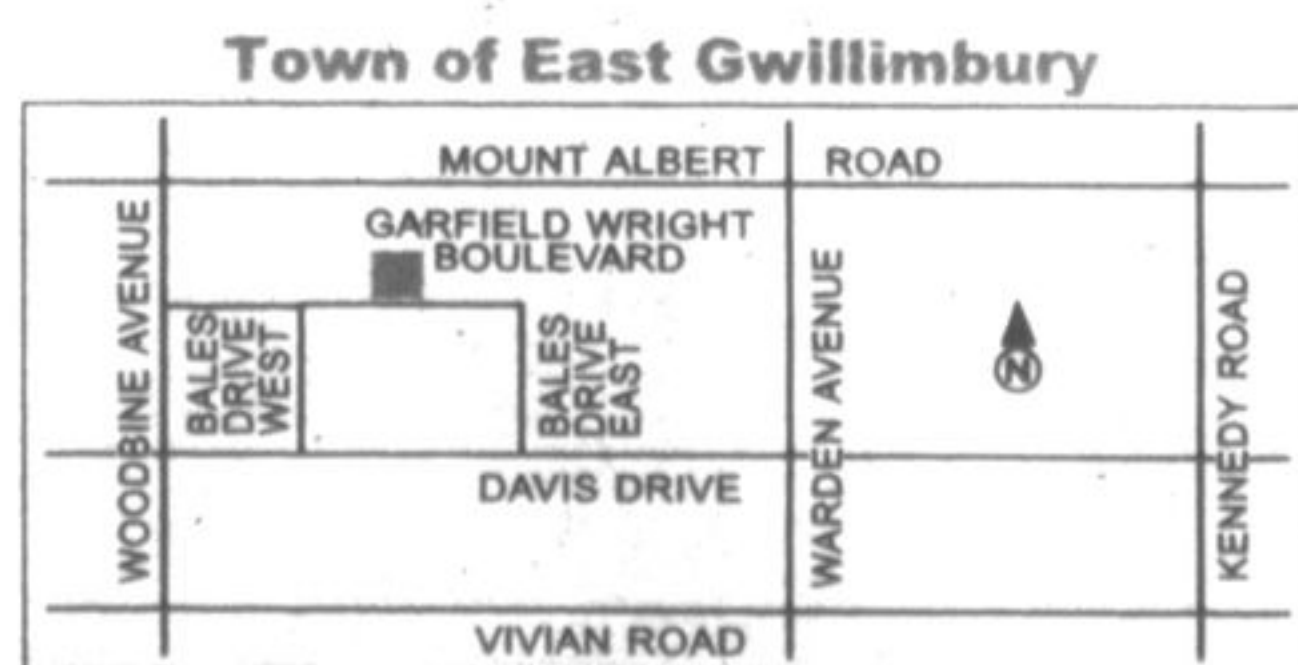

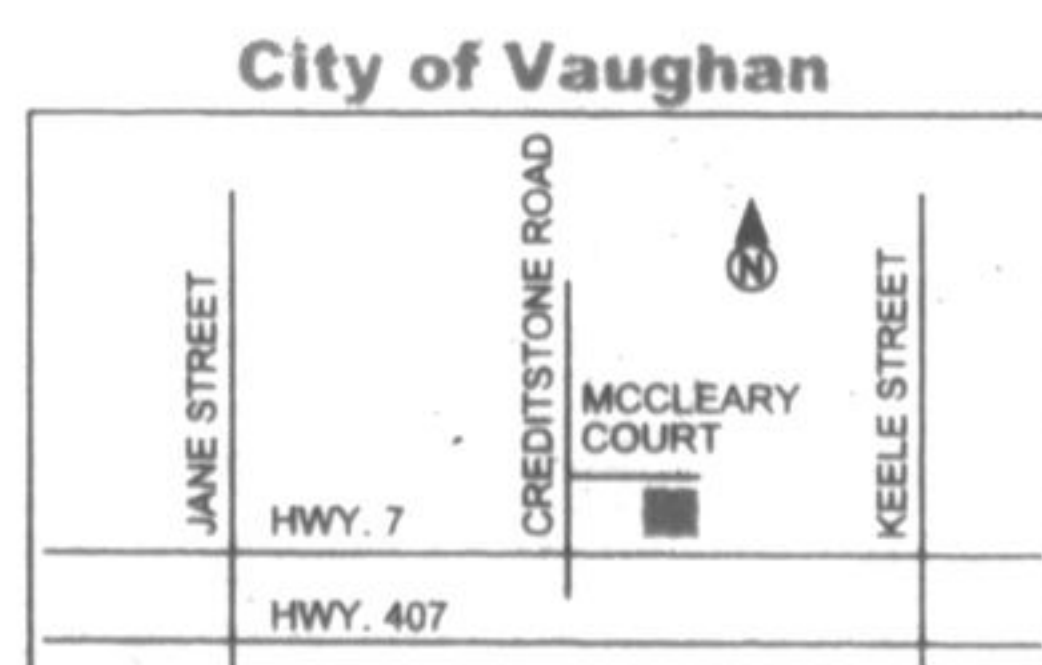

## Bethesda Road house fire 'suspicious': firefighters

were not home at the time, according to Cashel.

The outside of the home suffered smoke damage, however, the inside is in need of major repair.

"From what I saw, the house doesn't have to be knocked down," said Jeff Bignell, fire prevention officer for Whitchurch-Stouffville Fire and Emergency Services, who added the home's smoke detectors were working and ringing when the department arrived at the scene.

"But a lot of the contents are destroyed. ... There is some smoke and definite fire damage on the first and second floors," he said.

The Confalones have insurance and a place to live - Ms Confalone's brother also lives in Whitchurch-Stouffville.

"We'll be OK. We've got family," she said. "I'm not even going to think how inconvenient this is because my family is safe."

The fire is not thought to be suspicious. No cause has been determined.

While the family stood across the street to watch their home of six years become consumed by flames, neighbours rallied around them and brought the girls shoes, as they ran out of the house barefoot, a leash and water for Pumpkin the dog, as well as food for the kittens.

A large crowd of neighbours and passersby gathered as a news chopper circled overhead. York Regional Police closed the intersection.

At about 1 a.m. yesterday, local fire crews were called into action once again when the home at 2147 Bethesda Rd., between Hwy. 404 and Woodbine Avenue, was set ablaze.

The century home was vacant and had been for several months, as it was being renovated, according to Mr. Bignell.

"Because it was vacant and in a rural secluded area, we believe it was suspicious," Mr. Bignell said. "I'm sure it was beautiful in its day and the owners were trying to keep it looking like a beautiful century home."

The York Region Police and Ontario Fire Marshall's office have been called in to investigate this blaze.
