By league rules, the youngsters must play in 80 per cent of their regular season games and cannot be healthy scratches.


Vacancies on blueline forced Stouffville GM's hand

It was a challenging decision, especially with some young highend forwards and a couple of candidates from the Whitchurch-Stouffville area in the mix, Burrows


It boiled down to position.
