

Spirit hosts Habs after Waxer feast

LAST WEEK: Oct. 9: Pickering Panthers 4 vs. Stouffville Spirit 2. Oct. 12: Stouffville Spirit 3 vs. Markham Waxers 1. Spirit record: four wins, two shootout wins, four losses, 12 points.

COMING UP: Thursday: Toronto Junior A Canadiens vs. Stouffville Spirit at Stouffville Arena, 7:30 p.m. Friday: Stouffville at Peterborough, 7:30 p.m. Monday: Stouffville at Cobourg, 7 p.m.

GAME NOTES: Although the Central Canadian Hockey League regular season is still in its infant stages, it appears as if the Stouffville Spirit have the Markham Waxers' number. For the third time in as many outings, the Spirit defeated the Waxers. The most recent came on Thanksgiving Day when the Spirit skated off with a 3-1 win at the Stouffville Arena. The Spirit took a 2-0 lead after the opening period on a shorthanded goal by Alex Derlis and Tyler Ferry, with his first of the season. After the Waxers scored the lone goal of the second period, the Spirit added breathing room just past the midway point of the third period on a goal by Matt Neal. Spirit goalkeeper Kori Coelho, a former Waxers' midget, stopped 29 of 30 shots to help preserve the win.

The Spirit directed 34 shots on the Waxers' net. The win by the Spirit atoned for a disappointing 4-2 road loss they incurred in Pickering Friday. The host Panthers took a 1-0 lead after one period and padded it to 4-0 through two. The Spirit staged a late rally when Jordan Forfar, on a power-play effort, and Jason Deveny, with his first of the season, scored 14 seconds apart to cut their deficit. That would be as close as the Spirit would get. The Spirit outshot the Panthers 40-33. Coelho made his first start between the pipes for the Spirit after sitting out a four-game suspension.

INSIDER: Spirit head coach Craig Donovan expects forward Evan Bruno to return to action this week. The Stouffville resident was back on the ice practising with the team last week after battling remnants of mononucleosis.

GENERALLY SPEAKING: In defeating the Waxers for the

third time in as many outings this season, Donovan felt his club played their best period of hockey during the first period that saw them take a 2-0 lead. In explaining their success against the Waxers, Donovan speculated it could be due to the Markham-Unionville presence on their team. Donovan pointed out at least seven of his players (Shane Welker, Andrew Doyle, Chris Porter, Jason Deveny, Daniel Fitzgerald, Joseph Chemello and Christian Finch) are either from the Markham-Unionville area or played their minor hockey there at one point.

"I certainly can't complain about (winning three of three games against the Waxers)," Donovan said. "Our guys just seem to get up and be ready when we play against (the Waxers)."

"I thought we played our best period of the year during the first period Monday where we did everything right and I thought we played a solid overall defensive game."

Another aspect that pleased Donovan was the work of the forward line of Derlis, Doyle and Neal, which accounted for two goals against the Waxers.

"(The Spirit coaching staff) expected this line to provide some scoring for us. If we can get this line going, I feel we'll be in good shape," Donovan said.

While elated in defeating the Waxers, Donovan felt his club's loss to the Panthers last Friday could have been avoided were it not for a couple of miscues.

"I thought during the third period we really took it to them. But during the second period we made a couple of mistakes that led to odd-man rushes on their part and it hurt us. It shows that you have to play 60 minutes of hockey in this league," Donovan said.

Looking ahead to today's game against Toronto, Donovan said the Junior A Canadiens are a team that possesses a potent offensive attack. If the Spirit hope to extend their winning ways, Donovan predicted his club has to give another solid defensive effort.
