
Tickets are \$3 each and space is limited.



## H1N1 flu vaccine is available to everyone, BUT first to those who most need it:

- People under age 65 with chronic health conditions (such as diabetes, asthma, cancer or a condition that affects the heart, liver, lung, or immune system)
- Pregnant women
- Healthy children aged six months to less than five years
- People living in remote and isolated settings or communities
- Health care workers
- Household contacts and care providers of infants under six months or persons who may not respond to vaccines

Note: Children from six months to nine years of age should receive the vaccine in two half-doses, given at least 21 days apart. Individuals 10 years of age and older should receive one dose of the vaccine.

H1N1 flu vaccine can be given at the same time as seasonal flu shot and other vaccines.

Beginning October 28 clinics will run: Monday to Friday 12 p.m. to 8 p.m. Saturday and Sunday 12 p.m. to 5 p.m.

The H1N1 vaccine will be available to everyone else as more vaccine becomes available. For electronic tracking purposes only, we encourage you to bring your Health Card and/or Driver's Licence to the clinic.
