Croucher was especially happy for Rankin, who is the lone Grade 12 member on the team.

"She's our senior girls' team leader and it's nice for her to go to OFSAA," he said.

Among other results posted by members of the Spartans' team, Josephine Lipari finished 24th in the midget girls' 3,000 m.

In the senior boys' 7,000 m, James McLeod was 25th, Cody Fair 116th, Cody MacCharles 127th and Nick Kozak 174th.

The Spartans' junior girls' team finished sixth.

Olivia Bolender was the top Spartans' runner in the 3,800 m race finishing 39th. Nicole Thompson was 45th, Krista Bradshaw 53rd, Olivia Roman 84th and Ashley Johnston 87th.

As a whole, Croucher was pleased with the final results posted by the

"It was definitely better than we had expected and we're happy. It's the culmination to the season."
