GAME NOTES: The Stouffville Spirit were hoping to accomplish something no other club has done in the young Central Canadian Hockey League regular season. For the Spirit, their mission was to hand the Newmarket Hurricanes their first home-ice loss when they faced them last Sunday. Prior to last Sunday's game the Hurricanes were a perfect five for five on home ice. The Spirit gave the Hurricanes all they could handle before coming out on the short end of a 2-1 decision. After a scoreless 20 minutes, the Hurricanes scored a goal that Spirit netminder Kori Coelho would like to have back when a long shot by defenceman Adam Davies originating from near the Newmarket blueline took several odd bounces along the ice. Unfortunately for Coelho, the final bounce eluded his grasp into the net. While that goal could easily have taken the wind out of the Spirit's sails, it didn't as Greg Whittle scored early in the third period to tie the game. But the Hurricanes deposited the game-winner just past the midway point. The Spirit outshot the Hurricanes 24-21 in a contest that had a playoff-type atmosphere.



The Spirit entered last Sunday's game on a high after they routed the host Pickering Panthers 7-0 last Friday. That win atoned for a loss the Spirit incurred against the Panthers just one day earlier in Stouffville. In last Friday's game, unanswered goals by Alex Derlis and Evan Bruno staked the Spirit to a 2-0 lead through 20 minutes. Chris Chiste and Matt Neal, on a power play effort, scored unanswered goals in the second period to pad the Spirit's lead to 4-0 through two stanzas. Jordan Forfar, Bruno and Chris Porter rounded out the scoring in the third period. Daniel Fitzgerald collected two assists, as did Neal. Coelho stopped 22 shots to record his first shutout of the season.

INSIDER: Spirit defenceman Brennan Serville sprained an ankle last Friday while participating in a physical education class and is expected to be out for close to two weeks. After playing one of his best games of the season last Friday, Bruno

incurred a minor shoulder injury during the third period and was scratched from the roster in last Sunday's game in Newmarket. Spirit head coach Craig Donovan anticipates the Stouffville resident will be back in the lineup for today's game against the visiting Lindsay Muskies.

GENERALLY SPEAKING: Despite coming out on the short end of their game against the Hurricanes, Donovan was pleased with the effort his club gave.

"I thought we learned a couple of things from that game. One is that Newmarket is at where we want to be and I feel we can play with them. They're a little older in terms of junior A experience than us and I think we proved we could play with them.

"Our guys were disappointed after the game and felt we could have won. But I think it helped our confidence for a young team that we have," Donovan said.

Not only was Donovan satisfied with their play Sunday. Reflecting on the club's first 19 regular season tilts, Donovan is happy with the progress his youthful charges have made.

"From my point of view, with a young team you want to get better each week and our goal is to continue getting better and in developing our younger guys so that when the playoffs begin they'll have the confidence and have developed skill-wise. So far, I feel on the whole we are where we deserve to be at in the standings and where we had hoped to be at," he said.

Lea Sheffield placed third in the under-20 girls, under-52 kg. bracket.


The event, which Judo Ontario utilizes as a qualifying tournament for provincial teams, involved athletes from Canada, the United States and other countries, including Brazil.
