Captain leaves Spirit, asks for trade

Jordan Forfar is one unhappy camper. Acquired during the offseason from the Peterborough Stars by the Stouffville Spirit and named captain to start the Central Canadian Hockey League season, Forfar unexpectedly left the club last Saturday and has requested a trade.

Acknowledging he was taken a bit offguard by Forfar's sudden decision, Spirit general manager Kenny Burrows said the former Spirit captain wished to leave the club for several reasons.

They included disappointment in the amount of ice time he was receiving and the direction the team was going.

"It happens, you always get one or two players that are unhappy during the course of a year," Burrows said.

Burrows is trying to oblige with the 19year-old Mount Albert resident's wishes, but would like to get a player of his calibre in exchange.

In 28 games this season, Forfar had 10 goals and seven assists.

"It sounds like he wants to go out west and I talked with two teams from out there, but they either wanted to give me futures or cash and I said no," Burrows said yesterday.

Spirit head coach Craig Donovan was also taken by surprise.

"I've never experienced this before where your captain wanted to leave midway through the season. He gave no indication to (the coaching staff)," the first-year head coach said.


"He had a lot of energy and time that he gave off the ice. He was always the first guy to volunteer his time to the community and to minor hockey," Donovan said.

Forfar could not be reached for comment yesterday.

The Spirit named Declan Gunovski as their new captain.

Donovan called the decision an easy one. Gunovski was one of the finalists for the job in the pre-season.

Acquired part way through last season by the Spirit from the Couchiching Terriers, the 19-year-old forward made his presence

felt immediately scoring a pair of goals in the club's 6-1 win over the Ajax Attack at the Stouffville Arena Thursday.

"Declan made a good statement and he will lead us," Donovan said.

Alex Derlis also added a pair of goals for the Spirit, who held leads of 2-0 through 20 minutes and 5-0 through 40.

Matt Neal and Chris Porter added the other goals for the Spirit, who snapped a two-game losing streak and defeated the Attack for the third time in as many outings this season.

Spirit netminder Kori Coelho stopped 22 of 23 shots. The Spirit fired 41 shots on the Attack goal.

"The pucks went in and we played a good defensive game and had high intensity," Donovan said. "It's exactly what you want as a coach. If we can play like that every night, we'll win three-quarters of our games for sure."

With 12 wins, one overtime win, three shootout wins, one shootout loss and 13 losses, the Spirit moved into a fourth-place tie in the East Division with the Attack.
