Emmerson, Hargrave set to run

Rest of town council mum as election registration opens

Mayor Wayne Emmerson and Councillor Rob Hargrave have some unfinished business they would like to attend to, which is why both men have declared their intentions to seek re-election Oct. 25.

"I have a lot more things to do," Mr. Emmerson said. "I'm really looking forward to this next term of council because we've started some things in this municipality with this council and I'd like to see them finished."

Mr. Hargrave said he is 75-per-cent sure he will seek re-election. The only thing that would stop him would be a job relocation.

Assuming that is not going to take place in the immediate future, Mr. Hargrave wants to sit on council for a third term so he can not only keep a watchful eye on how the municipality spends its money, but to also ensure the growth of Whitchurch-Stouffville remains manageable.

"I see the town is still in growth mode, which is great, but we have to exercise caution and make sure the infrastructure is in place," he said.

Ward 5 Councillor Richard Bartley, who is just wrapping up his first term on council, remains undecided.

"I am thinking of running in the 2010 election. I am going to sit down with my family and see what they think of this decision," he said. "It has been a huge learning experience
