H1N1 flu vaccine To be protected against the H1N1 flu, you need the H1N1 flu vaccine. The seasonal flu shot will not protect you against the H1N1 flu virus.

- Pregnant women and people aged 10 to 64 years old who do not have any chronic health conditions can get unadjuvanted H1N1 flu vaccine at York Region's seasonal flu shot clinics.
- Parents of children who require a second dose of the H1N1 flu vaccine and people with chronic health conditions should call York Region Health Connection at 1-800-361-5653 for an appointment and the locations and times of the clinics where they can receive the adjuvanted H1N1 vaccine.
