## Spirit head coach big fan of shootouts this season

GAME NOTES: When the Stouffville Spirit were forced into a shootout during their Central Canadian Hockey League contest against the East Division-leading Wellington Dukes last Saturday, head coach Craig

Donovan felt it played right into their hands. The Spirit had won three of four shootouts this year, the first-year head said. They made it 4-for-5 with a 3-2 triumph. Of those four shootout victories, two were against the Dukes, both at the Stouffville Arena.

In Saturday's tilt, Spirit netminder Kori
Coelho stoned the Dukes during the
shootout as he stopped Joe Zarbo, Jeremy
Franklin and Adam Zamec. After the Spirit's
first shooter Greg Whittle was foiled, Alex
Derlis made good on his attempt to give
Stouffville the win and extra point. During regulation play, the Dukes took a 1-0
lead after one period. The Spirit evened
the count just before the midway point of

the second period on a power-play goal by Declan Gunovski. But with just 26 seconds remaining in the period, the Dukes took advantage of a power-play opportunity and scored to regain the upper hand. The Spirit forced overtime when Andrew Doyle scored to tie the game with just 64 seconds remaining in the third period. The Spirit outshot the Dukes 33-28.

INSIDER: The victory by the Spirit, combined with the Cobourg Cougars' 6-3 loss to Ajax Sunday, assured Stouffville of a berth in next month's playoffs.

Forward Jason Heydon, who has been out with a shoulder injury since Nov. 5, has

been cleared to return to the lineup.

The Spirit filled their final player card
Tuesday by adding forward Kurtis Hulshof.
The younger brother of Spirit forward Justin
Hulshof, the 18-year-old Stouffville resident
played with the Spirit at the start of last
season and had two assists in 13 games.
He played part of this season with the
Markham Waxers and had one goal in three
games before he was released.


GENERALLY SPEAKING: "I definitely feel we have an advantage whenever we get into a shootout," Donovan said. "Not only do we have a good goalkeeper in Kori (Coelho), but our shooting percentage on breakaways


is close to .500 per cent. Normally goalies save around 70 per cent of breakaway attempts on the whole. If we're shooting at a .500 clip and on a whole, the average for guys scoring on breakaways is at around .200 to .300, I feel we should win most of the time in shootouts," he said.

Donovan said his club cannot afford to rest.


