


ENTERTAINMENT: Young talent ready to shine

When Amanda Belardinelli concerts at the Air Canada Centre sell out in a matter of minutes, you can say you saw her perform when she was an up-and-coming 16-year-old trying to make it in the business.

Providing you head over to the Lebovic Centre for Arts and Entertainment - Nineteen on the Park this Sunday night for a concert by the students of Stouffville's We Rock School of Music.

"She's positioned to be, I think, one of the most dominant young singers in Canada," said Jim McMillan, president of the music school Ms Belardinelli attends.

And she's not alone.

Other students taking to the stage this

weekend include fingerstyle guitarist Shayla Brown, electric guitarist Dylan Cook, bassist Matthew Renzoni and singer Maddy Stover. All have been with the school a year or two.

The students will be joined by professional singer Jennifer Kazmirchuk and Midlife Crisis drummer Jon Bouwmeister.

Last year's concert drew more than 200 people, according to Mr. McMillan.

"People couldn't get in. It was overwhelming ... and people were overwhelmed by the talent," he said.
