



FAITH: New priest at Stouffville church no stranger

Modern services on Anglican agenda

When Rev. Jason Prisley became the priestin-charge at Christ Church Stouffville, he had to learn a few new skills such as building maintenance and budgeting.

"Those kinds of things, we don't learn in seminary school," Rev. Prisley said.

Rev. Prisley first came to Stouffville in 2007 as an associate priest under Cannon Robert Shields.

"Rob was great, excellent to work with," Rev. Prisley said.

After 18 years as the head of Christ Church Stouffville, this past October, Rev. Shields moved to a parish in Oshawa, which provided the opportunity for Rev. Prisley to become the church's full-time leader.

"The bishop and the parish and my family decided if we could stay for some stability and keep the growth going" that would be great, he said.

Rev. Prisley is not interested in making dramatic changes to the church.

"Rob and the leadership created some great programs. So if it's not broke, don't fix it," he said.

However, Rev. Prisley does want to tweak a thing or two.

The first is to hold a modern and intergenerational service once a month on Sunday afternoons.

"It will be a loose service ... it's more of a

fellowship gathering," he said.

After last year's success with the church's first Blessing of the Animals, Rev. Prisley wants to expand it.

"We're really going to try and ramp that up," he said of the service that will be moved to late September, from early October, to accommodate the livestock owners who also participate in the Markham Fair, which falls during the traditional weekend of the blessing.

Rev. Prisley grew up in the Baptist church in the Beach, but moved to the Anglican church in 2000 after delving into British history in university.

"It really spoke to me," he said.

Rev. Prisley was ordained in 2005 after graduating from University of Toronto's Wycliffe College.

He then spent two years at Toronto's Christ Church Deer Park before coming to Stouffville as an associate priest.

OFFICIALLY INDUCTED

Rev. Prisley lives in North York with his wife, Nadine, a court officer for the Toronto Police Service and their cat Ginger.

"If there's an emergency, I'm here, right away," he said.

Rev. John Anderson is the church's assistant curate.

Rev. Prisley was officially inducted as Christ Church Stouffville's priest-in-charge this past Tuesday by Bishop George Elliott.

Christ Church Stouffville is located at 254 Sunset Blvd.
