There are day, hockey and power skating camps and the sugar bush is open.


#### **Creative kids**

### 23 CHARGED IN TOWN DRUG SWEEP

Twenty-three people have been charged with a variety of drug-related offences in Whitchurch-Stouffville.

The charges were laid by officers from York Region Police's 5 District (Stouffville and Markham) unit after spending the month of February targeting street-level drug dealings in

town. Marijuana was the drug of choice.

"We are committed to ensuring the neighbourhoods of Stouffville remain safe," said York Region Police Supt. Robertson Rouse. "That's the bottom line and why we're out there doing this."

As a result of the investigation, which stemmed from tips by the public, search warrants were executed for various residences in

and around Whitchurch-Stouffville, with the majority of them being in urban Stouffville. The warrants resulted in the seizure of more than 950 grams of marijuana and \$850 in cash.

No grow-ops were located.

The 23 accused are male, female, young offenders and adults and have been charged
