Car misses firefighters, hits downtown fence

A 38-year-old Whitchurch-Stouffville man faces drug, drunk-driving and probation charges after a car slammed into a fence at Main Street and Freel Lane in downtown Stouffville just after midnight on March 1.

Stouffville fire and emergency personnel were in the area responding to an unrelated call when they saw a man drive around the firefighters and trucks, without making an attempt to stop or slow the vehicle down.

The vehicle subsequently slammed into a fence. The damage is estimated to be less than \$5,000.

The Whitchurch-Stouffville man has been charged with cocaine possession, impaired operation of a vehicle by way of alcohol, dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, mischief damage, failure to obey a recognizance order and breach of probation.

Bar fight charges follow purse theft

A missing purse has resulted in a 19-year-old Whitchurch-Stouffville man being charged with two counts of assault with a weapon and one count of breach of probation.

The incident took place in the early morning hours of Feb. 26 at Sports Nut Bar and Grill in Markham.

A woman told police she placed her purse on a hook inside the bar, then a very short time later noticed it was missing.

The woman and her companions then searched the bar for the purse. They found it under the pool table the accused and two other people were playing on.

A scuffle took place during which the woman was struck with a pint glass and a man with a beer bottle.
