# Knox, Crago bronzed at CIS championships

Gold was the preferred colour for the two Stouffville residents playing for the Wilfrid Laurier University Golden Hawks at the Canadian Interuniversity Sport women's ice hockey championships in Antingonish, N.S. last weekend.

What veteran goalkeeper Liz Knox and first-year forward Brittany Crago settled for when the tournament concluded Sunday was a reward bearing a different colour - bronze.

Entering the four-day tournament as the second seed, the Golden Hawks finished third after blanking the fourth-seeded Saint Mary's Huskies 4-0 in the consolation final.

Knox, who was recently named the CIS Player of the Year, stopped all nine shots directed her way to record the shutout.

A 1-0 loss in their opening game against the eventual gold medallists in the University of Alberta Pandas tarnished the Golden Hawks chances.

"We're certainly not disappointed," Knox said. "I know the focus is on the colour of the medal around our necks. But we played three solid games of hockey last weekend. The Alberta game was a very tough challenge for us and they proved themselves to be worthy of a gold medal."

The fourth-year student has one year of playing eligibility remaining and intends to utilize it next season for the Golden Hawks when they host the nationals.

"This team and this school has given me four of the best years of my life; why not take one more?" she said.

"And with Wilfrid Laurier hosting next year's nationals, it would be such an incredible experience to play for the home crowd. It's not every day that you get to be a part of something special like that," she said.


The Clippers forced a deciding game when they staved off elimination in the fourth game with a 4-2 win.
