COMMUNITY: \$50M needed for furnishings, fixtures

Taste of Tahiti at gala will help expand hospital

Markham and Stouffville's population is expanding and its hospital must grow with it.

So says Carol Wildgoose, who spoke at a Markham Stouffville Hospital fundraiser kickoff last week.

The hospital holds an annual fundrasing gala and this year, the gala will be named The Tahitian Ball.

The fundraiser kick-off was held at The Village Grocer in Unionville, which is a gala sponsor. Staff wore leis while Tahitian music played in the background.

Last year's gala centred on Ireland.

"The hospital is the centre of our community," said Ms Wildgoose, chairperson of this year's gala event.

Markham Stouffville Hospital opened in 1990 to serve 77,000 people in the Markham Stouffville area. Today, that population has expanded to more than 300,000 people and the hospital also serves part of the Durham area.

"The ... community is growing immensely. Everything was designed around a smaller population. The demand on the hospital is huge, based on the increase in population," Ms Wildgoose said.

The hospital site is being prepared for construction, which will begin in the fall. The new

hospital will be open to the public in 2014.

The hospital's expansion campaign needs to raise \$50 million to fund furnishings, fixtures and equipment — items not covered by government funding.

The fundraising goal for the gala is \$450,000. Last year's gala raised \$400,000 toward the expansion.

A trip to Tahiti will be auctioned off at the gala. A 2010 Hyundai Accent will be the grand prize in the gala's raffle.

The gala is on April 9 at Hilton Suites Markham.




