## Town gears up for Earth Day

More than 300 people filled 1,200 garbage bags last year.

ing our broadcasts," Peter Fraunberger, chair of WhiStle Radio said in an interview with the Sun-Tribune.

"Going mobile with a broadcast in the event of an emergency will also become a reality following some upcoming tests once our move has been completed."

All was not lost for the not-for-profit radio station. It received a \$2,000 grant from the town, despite being told in 2009 it would receive, at the time, a one-off grant of \$2,500. This year, the Mayor's Golf Tournament Committee also donated \$1,000 to the station.

"Having acquired these monies from the town demonstrates a possible and growing partnership that WhiStle Radio hopes will continue well into the future," Mr. Fraunberger said.

As of April 1, WhiStle Radio will broadcast out of a new location — the basement of Stouffville Fine Furniture.
