



Mayor Wayne Emmerson of the fire department.

The 10 other employees to make this list earned between \$125,450 and \$101,136.

The salaries of department heads and the CAO are decided by council and based on municipal comparators, Mr. Cash said.

"I don't set my own salary," he said. "We're not the highest paying. We're not the lowest paying. We're in the middle."

There are three different comparator lists the municipality uses - one for firefighters, another for CUPE members and one for nonunion employees.

Tom Parry, director of engineering and capital works made \$125,450.

Clerk Michele Kennedy, treasurer Marc Pourvahidi and director of public works Paul Whitehouse all earned \$122,492, which was up from the \$115,601 they each earned the year before.

Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library CEO Carolyn Nordheimer James made the list for the first time with a salary of \$108,859 in 2009, as did Rob Raycroft, director of leisure services (\$102,943), human resource manager Gary Sumner (\$102,158) and public works operations manager Denis Chartrand (\$101,877)

The list also included director of planning and building services Andrew McNeely (\$108,730) and deputy fire chief Robert McKenzie (\$108,596).
