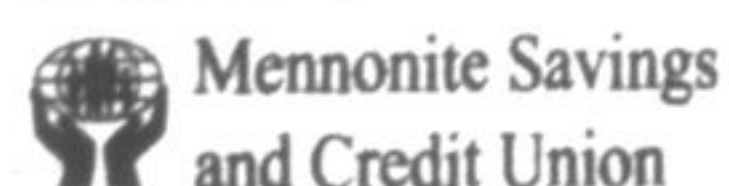

More grant money for WhiStle

WhiStle Radio has received a \$15,000 grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation.

"We're ecstatic," said Peter Fraun-

berger, spokesperson and chairperson of the Main Street station. "A lot of people don't get this support from the government."

The foundation recently awarded \$3,018,200 in community grants to 31 local not-for-profit and charitable organizations within Simcoe-York.

The radio station's grant is going to be used to upgrade technical equipment.

"You can't be paying for your rent (with the grant). It has to be used strictly to enhance the station itself," Mr. Fraunberger said. "Within six months to a year, things are becoming obsolete technology-wise, so we're trying to keep up to date."

This is not the first time WhiStle has received a grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation. The first, in 2008 for \$15,000, was used for the purchase of equipment.

Last month, WhiStle received a \$2,000 grant from the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, which Mr. Fraunberger said will likely be used to pay for a portable generator so the station can broadcast in a power outage.

The station also received a \$1,000 grant from the Mayor's Golf Committee. That money has yet to be earmarked for anything specific, according to Mr. Fraunberger.

In January 2009, the station, which broadcasts in the Stouffville area at 102.7 FM, received \$2,500 from the town.

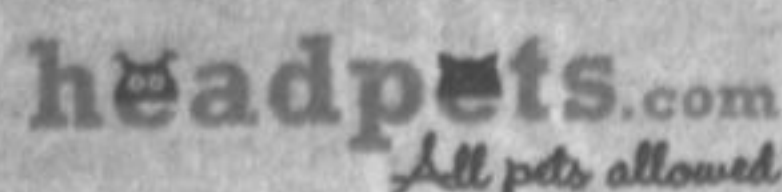
