Adding to the enthusiasm of the moment was the fact I suddenly felt much like a modernday Glenn Ford, Jimmy Stewart and Gregory Peck rolled into one.

"Take a couple of days to think about it," the director suggested. "Then give me a call."

It was during this interval, my head left the clouds and my feet hit the floor.
