Mom launches reward bucks for children

Elizabeth Johnston has created a reward and redemption game for parents and kids entitled Kids Cash.

"It's to motivate children and get children away from video games and television," the Whitchurch-Stouffville resident said.

The program is aimed at children aged three to 10.

The children receive Kids Cash reward dollars from their parents for completed chores or good behaviour. The children then redeem the 'cash' for a specific amount of video game playing time or something else agreed upon by the parents and children.

The reward dollars can even be saved up for a larger treat, such as a day at the zoo, Ms Johnston said.

"We're in the give-me, give-me generation (and) I'm implementing a tool for self discipline," she said.

The concept of rewarding desirable behaviour is not new to Ms Johnston who, 20 years ago, created TV Tickets for her own children.

"I didn't like children watching TV all the time and I needed a way to tell (my) children you can't watch it all the time," she said.

An added benefit Ms Johnston is hoping for is money management.

"If (the children have) been working with cash earlier in their life, then maybe it's not such a big thing" when they get older, she said.

Ms Johnston suggests using different coloured coupons for each child in order to keep things simple.

The program will be officially launched at a reception Saturday at Hanson's Restaurant, 3721 Aurora Rd. at Kennedy Road, from 7 to 8 p.m.
