"I've made such good friends I don't want to leave them and I love the sport; it just feels great to skate," she said.

Ms Berry, a Grade 12 student at Stouffville District Secondary School, will be attending either Laurier or McMaster university for kinesiology this fall.

"I want to stay in sports and sports therapy," she said.

But it does not mean she will be staying on the sidelines.

"I never thought I was going to make it to the Olympics. I want to do shows like Disney on Ice and coaching," Ms Berry said, adding she will be taking a coaching course over the summer.

While Ms Berry has performed in a handful of the club's bi-annual revues, for many of the 165-plus skaters aged three to 18, this

is the first time they will be performing in front of more than just mom, dad and their coaches.

"We look forward to it from Day One," Ms Berry said. "We have a countdown going on.

Fire hall, arena under budget

The fire hall/Stouffville Clippers Sports Complex project is expected to come in under budget.

As of the end of March, project manager MHPM forecasts the cost of the project, upon completion, will be \$26,396,475, which is \$150,897 under budget, according to an April 20 report to council.

"While no significant change to this forecast is anticipated, it cannot be considered the final project costs, which will be provided by the (town's) finance department at year end," reads the report.

"One of the variances will be cost recovery from York Region EMS for their portion of the fire hall building and site works of 11.5 per cent of the fire hall costs. This amounts to an estimated \$750,000, however, allocation of change order costs have yet to be finalized with York Region."

Substantial completion and occupancy

of the fire hall took place on Nov. 2 with both fire and EMS moving into the facility on Nov. 27 of last year.

The arena was substantially completed and occupancy occurred on Feb. 1 and the building opened to the public on Feb. 2.

"Both buildings are now operational, however, as with any new facility there are various items that will require modifications or adjustments to ensure the building operates efficiently and meets the needs of the users as intended in the design," the report reads. "This work will continue over the next few months. Various landscaping and finishing details remain outstanding and will be completed by (the contractor) Norlon (Builders London Ltd.) as soon as the weather permits."

The fire hall officially opened yesterday. The arena opening ceremonies are set for May 8.
