Double play: 2nd fastball team slides into town

When the first pitch is thrown out to start the Oshawa City and District Fastball League this season, there will be more than just one team in Stouffville.

While the Stouffville Mennos play their traditional home games at Memorial Park Thursday evenings, another local entry will do the same during the same 8:30 p.m. time slot at a nearby location.

'Not many of us left': veterans

Stouffville friends off to weekend Second World War ceremonies

Jim Rae wanted to be an aero engine mechanic when he enlisted in the Canadian Air Force, but the military had enough of them, so he became an air frame mechanic.

Cyril Back, who was born in Canada but moved to Britain at three-and-a-half years of age with his family, was drafted into the British Royal Air Force and wanted to be a pilot. But he was too light, even after six months of trying to gain weight.

The British military, however, still wanted Mr. Back. He became a member of the tactical air force mobile headquarters unit as well as a member of an air sea squadron.

The two men never met during the Second World War, but the pair became fast friends during their weekly bridge games at the Silver Jubilee Club for seniors in Stouffville. The pair will be attending the 65th anniversary of VE Day on Saturday in Hamilton together.

"There are not many of us left," Mr. Back, 88, said.

"I think (these types of celebrations are) very important to the veterans, I really do," Mr. Rae said. "They bring back a lot of memories
