From beginning to end with a few minor indiscretions – I enjoyed the entire show, a fitting tribute to 50 glorious years.

In short, the chorus was wonderful, the dancers were dazzling, the black light was brilliant, the costuming was sparkling and the skits were (for the most part) amusing.

Topping the rave rating was Battle Hymn of the Republic, a marvelous presentation by the chorus and accompanying alumni. It stirred audiences like nothing recalled in a half-century of Music Mania memories. But, unfortunately, the selection wasn't sufficient to raise conservative spectators from their collective seats – a still-baffling Stouffville dilemma.

This frustration, however, was substituted throughout the evening by appreciative applause and simultaneous laughter, a reaction that spurred performers to exceptional heights.

A tip of the tuque to: Rick Lightfoot (director); Fenella Smith (producer); Lisa Harvey (chorus); Natalie Wood (dance); Bruce and Bunny Burton (black light); Bryan Gray (skits); and all those behind the scenes for a job well done.
