The soulful sounds of reggae, calypso, ska and jazz can be heard tomorrow night when the Toronto Mass Choir performs at Springvale Baptist Church.

The concert is a fundraiser for the Stouffville Christian School.

"I've heard them a couple of times," said school principal Jake Vriend. "They're a dynamite group.

The not-for-profit 30-strong singers and fourpiece band have travelled around the world and garnered numerous awards, including the Covenant 2006 award for traditional gospel album of the year for The Live Experience CD.

Other accolades include a Juno award for contemporary Christian/gospel album of the year (2003), a Vibe award for contemporary urban gospel album of the year (2003) and the Maja award for gospel choir of the year (2003).

The choir, with members from various churches and denominations, is directed by Karen Burke, a graduate of the Royal Conservatory of Music and a professor of music at York University.

Money raised will help pay for the private school's budget and its move from EastRidge Evangelical Missionary Church to Springvale this

"Our tuition doesn't help cover all of our costs," Mr. Vriend said. "Anything extra will go towards the build-out at Springvale."

Three years ago, the school moved from Altona, just east of Whitchurch-Stouffville to East-Ridge.




