

BUSINESS: McGuinty announces grant to Teva during Israeli trade trip

Stouffville drug plant gets \$6.5 M from province

Teva Canada received a \$6.5-million grant from the Ontario government Tuesday.

The cash injection will enable the Stouffville generic pharmaceutical manufacturer to retain its 182 skilled workers and hire 20 new employees.

"(The expansion) will enable us to secure Canadian and export mandates for high-quality, value-priced generic medicines," said Barry Fishman, president and CEO of Teva Canada Limited.

"This partnership with the Ontario Government to construct an advanced manufacturing facility will increase Teva Canada's capabilities and capacity and allow us to retain and grow high-value jobs in Ontario."

The partnership was announced on the same day Premier Dalton McGuinty met with scientists at Israel's Weizmann Institute of Science to explore opportunities for new partnerships and investment.

"Teva Pharmaceuticals is a perfect example of the kind of partner we're looking for in Israel. This is a country where scientists and academic leaders have figured out how

to turn today's ideas into tomorrow's new investments," Mr. McGuinty said. "We're here to learn and promote the benefits of doing business with Ontario's life sciences companies."

Teva Canada is also investing \$56 million into the Stouffville plant's expansion.

One of the largest pharmaceutical manufacturing centres in North America, the Stouffville location employs about 300 people and produces more than 400 different formulations, primarily for the North American market, according to its website.

The Stouffville facility has an on-site quality-assurance department as well as corporate technical operations and engineering.
