
The clean-up day stems from a rash of private and public properties being tagged late last year.

WALK AWAY FROM 'MESS', GRANT MONEY AT BALL DIAMOND, HARGRAVE TELLS COUNCIL MATES

Councillor loses battle of Memorial Park

Councillor Rob Hargrave wants to walk away from more than \$500,000 in government funding so the new council can create a cohesive Stouffville Memorial Park master plan.

Last year, the town was awarded \$825,000 from the Recreational Infrastructure Canada program to reconstruct the last remaining softball diamond in the downtown park.

The funding is divided equally between the federal and provincial governments as well as the Town of

Whitchurch-Stouffville.

When the tender were received last month, the lowest bid came from Latitude 67 Ltd. at \$933,466.16, including all taxes. A contingency amount of \$115,000 was also approved, bringing the total cost to \$1,048,466.20

The increased cost was due to

the HST, which takes effect July 1 as well as additional work not included in the original 2009 budget.

However, the town is eligible for a rebate on a portion of the HST, which brings the variance down to \$140,860.
