

Stouffville racer Morad grabs checkered flag in England

It took Daniel Morad eight attempts.

But in last Sunday's eighth round of the GP3 auto racing series, the 20-year-old Stouffville resident finally claimed the checkered flag in a race staged at Silverstone Circuit in Silverstone, England.

Also recording the fastest lap in the 17-lap or 30-minute timed race, Morad felt everything seemed to fall perfectly into place for his first-ever victory.

"My start was perfect; I don't think I can repeat that," he said on the GP3 series

news website. "I don't really remember the lights going out, I kind of just did and it was good.

"So from there I had a seven-tenth gap by the end of the first lap and by the time I broke the draft it was pretty easy sailing. When you have clean air it is pretty easy to get away from the car behind. Not to say the car wasn't perfect, because it was. It's probably the best car I've ever driven, this year for sure, and probably top three in my life.

"I couldn't be happier. It's great for our

team (Status Grand Prix)." Since making his GP3 series debut, which is a new championship supporting Formula One races, Morad's best finishes prior to last Sunday were two fifth-place results in the third and fourth rounds at Istanbul, Turkey.

Entering Sunday's eighth round, Morad sped his way to a seventh-place showing in Saturday's race.

With the victory, Morad vaulted up in the driver's standings to sixth place after being in 12th.

Esteban Gutiérrez leads the series with 51 points.

aging those who don't to do so, Ms Armstrong said the program will shift to overall cycling etiquette and safety awareness next year.

"We will incorporate rides led by (an experienced cyclist) during recreation month to demonstrate good cycling etiquette and intro-

duce some of our trails," Ms Armstrong said.

Main Street has become a busy thoroughfare for cyclists of all ages. But with bike paths on Hoover Park Drive and throughout Whitchurch-Stouffville, Ms Armstrong said it's time to ride elsewhere.

"Main Street is not the place for a leisurely bike ride," she said. "Me, as a

cyclist, I avoid Main Street." It takes two seconds more to take a route more suited to cyclists, she said.

But if people do insist on riding on Main Street, in particular, on its sidewalks, Ms Armstrong has this advice: "(Cyclists) need to yield to pedestrians, they have the right of way. ... As a guest (on the sidewalk) you stop and wait."

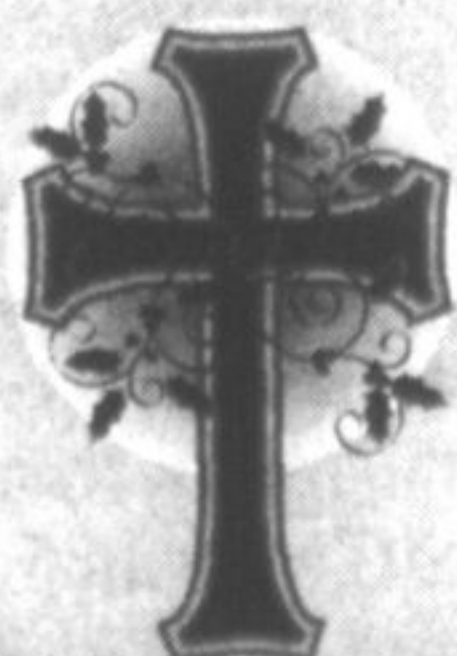
