CRIME: Martial arts studio break-in

Man surrenders seven months later

A 42-year-old Stouffville man turned himself into police, seven months after a break-in into at a Main Street business.

During the overnight hours of Jan. 21 a back door in a plaza at 5402 Main St. in west-end Stouffville had been smashed as had the glass to the doors of Master Myung Tae Kwon Do which is in the plaza.

On July 22, a Whitchurch-Stouffville man turned himself in at York Regional Police's offices in Markham.

The man has been charged with break and enter, failure to comply with a previous recognizance and two counts of breach of probation.

Thieves target unlocked vehicles

Laptops, money, iPods, GPS systems, Bluetooths and tools have all been stolen from vehicles in Whitchurch-Stouffville and Markham between June 1 and July 17.

Of the 66 cases reported within York Region Police's District 5, eight of them occurred in the Stouffville area.

These thefts are based on opportunity - cars being left unlocked and unattended with valuable items in plain view.

In order to prevent this from happening to you, take these precautions: lock your vehicle, park in well-lit areas, install anti-theft devices such as a car alarm, ignition kill switch or vehicle tracking system.

Do not leave valuables visible inside the vehicle - place them in the trunk or take them

out of the vehicle, police say.

Write down the serial number for all electronic devices or big ticket items to help investigators track the property down and do not leave the vehicle running if no one is in it.
