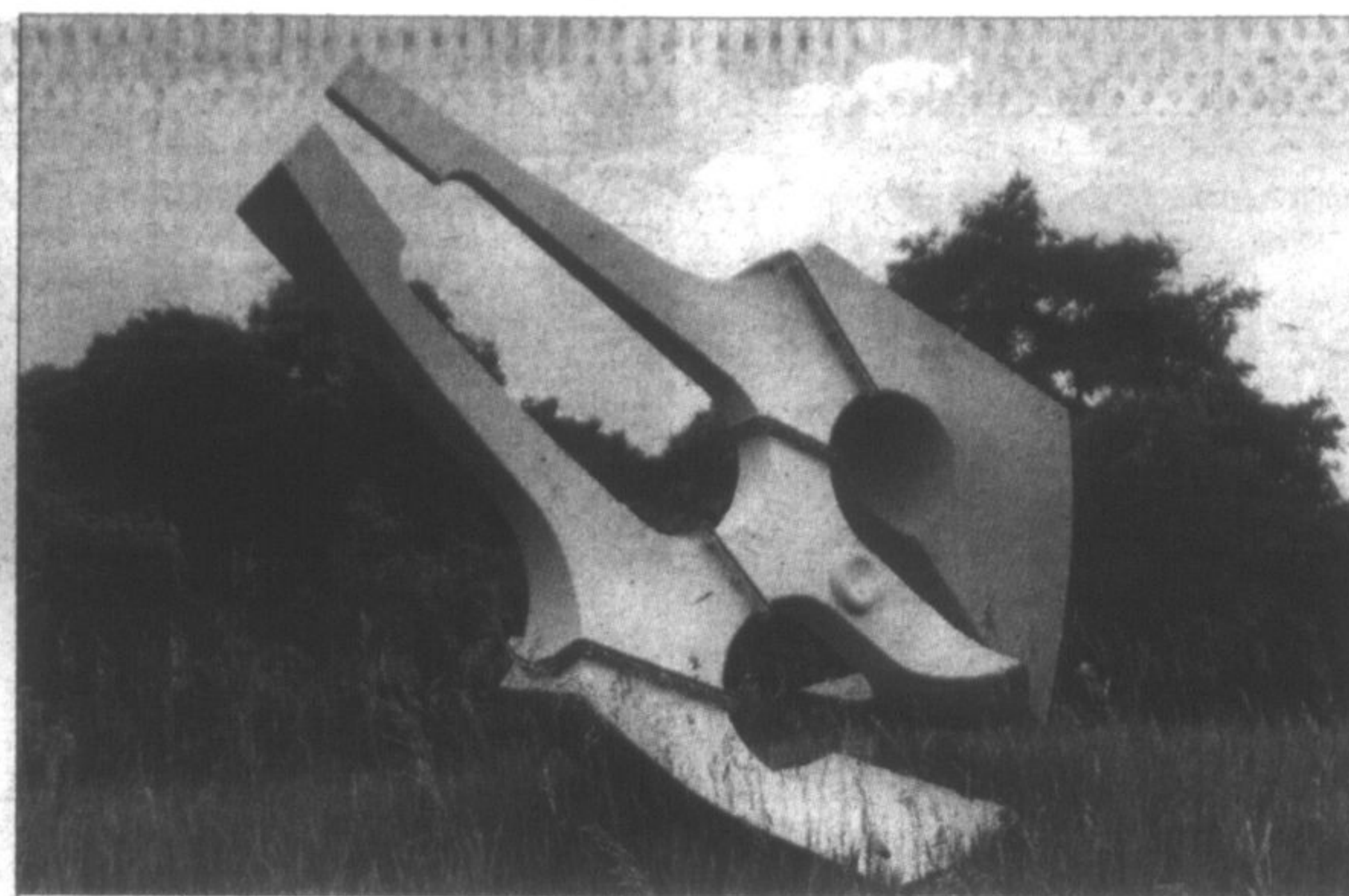

Angel, by Ron Baird of Uxbridge, will be installed in downtown Stouffville this month. It's inspired town council to name a sculpture walk area.

Angel will be part of trail

A sculpture donated by Uxbridge artist Ron Baird has led to the creation of an outdoor art viewing area in downtown Stouffville.

The sculpture, entitled Angel, was donated to the Latcham Gallery earlier this year and will be installed adjacent the existing off-road trail that runs between Main and Market streets.

In conjunction with the installation of Angel, the Downtown Stouffville Working Group has taken the opportunity to reinforce pedestrian activity in the area and over time, develop a larger attraction for viewing art in public spaces within downtown Stouffville, according to Andrew McNeely, director of planning and building services for the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville.

On Tuesday night, council formalized

the existing off-road trail between Main and Somerville streets as an area where artwork and sculptures can be erected for public viewing.

The area will be called Duffins - Stouffville Sculpture Walk. A trail name will be assigned by council.

The area will be enhanced with additional landscaping and tree planting, park benches, retrofitted trail entry points and the installation of garbage and recycling containers, according to Mr. McNeely.

"These improvements will provide for a positive reinforcement to the objectives of developing art in public spaces at this location and the launch of Angel," Mr. McNeely wrote.

Angel is expected to be installed by the middle of this month.

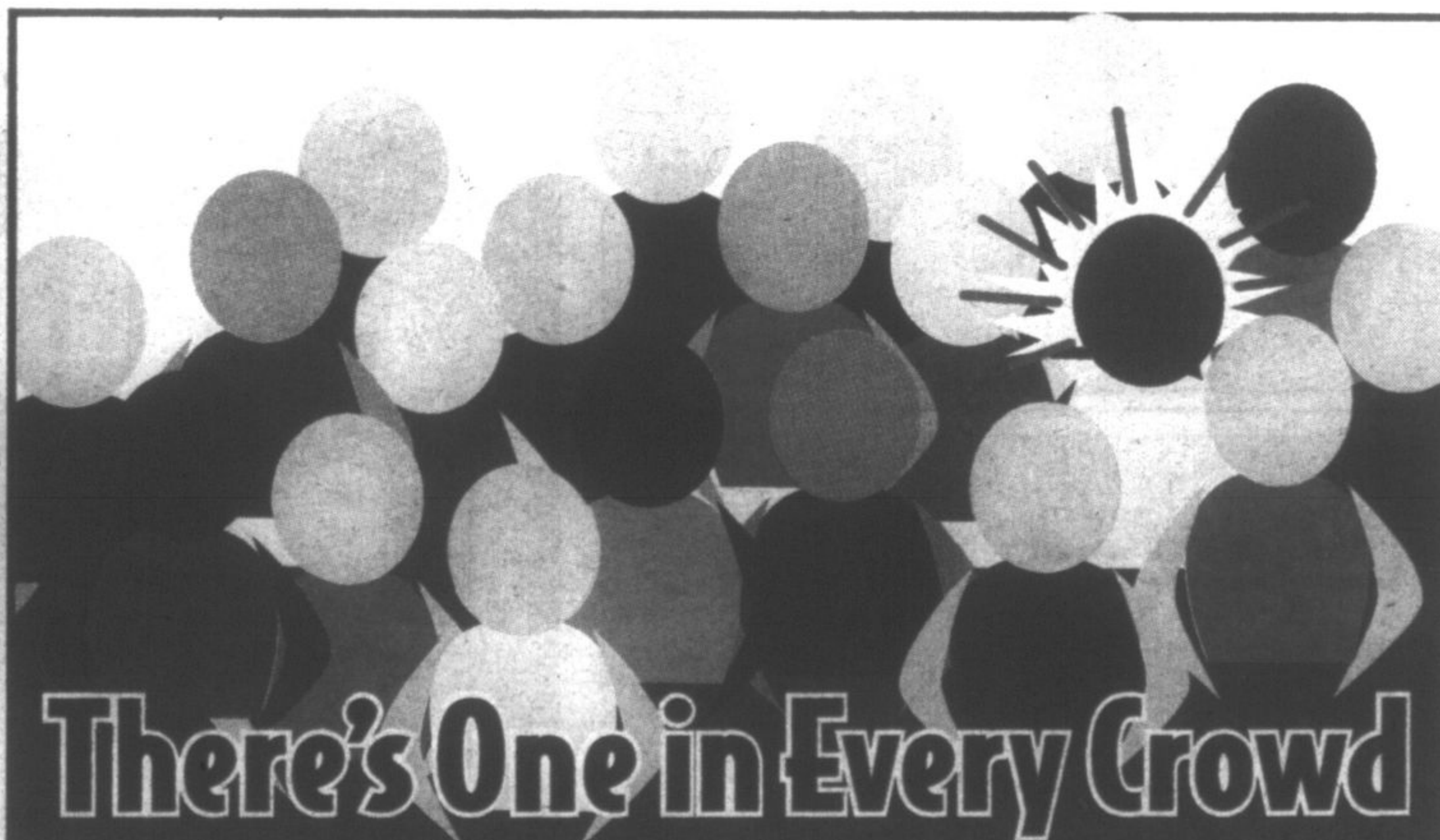

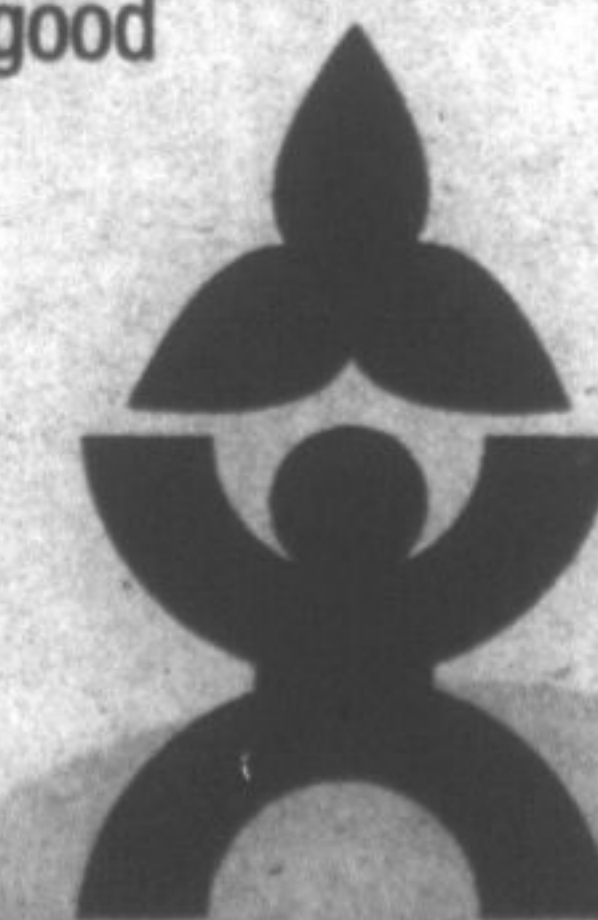
