GTA housing market slows

The real estate market's summer slowdown continued last month as sales declined 22 per cent compared to August 2009.

More than 6,200 homes changed hands in August, compared to more than 8,000 in the same period last year, according to the latest numbers from the Toronto Real Estate Board.

New listings also slowed, dropping by 1 per cent to 10,488.

At the same time, average prices inched up 6 per cent to a GTA average of \$411,012.

"Market conditions and the affordability picture would have to change dramatically before a sustained drop in the average selling price would take place," board senior manager of market analysis Jason Mercer said.

The prospect of interest rate hikes and new mortgage lending rules prompted some households to purchase a home sooner than they otherwise would have this year. The result has been a larger than normal dip in sales over the summer.

Board president Bill Johnston said several factors drove homebuyers to move earlier in the year than they otherwise might have.

July sales were also quiet with fewer than 6,500 homes sold and listings at their lowest levels since 2002.

BY THE NUMBERS

• Markham (N11) was the first district in York Region to hit a total volume of more than \$1 billion in sales this year, sitting at \$1,031,820,381 at the end of August. Vaughan (N08) is likely to do the same soon, now sitting at more than \$900,0000;

• The average number of days a house spends on the market has decreased since spring. Sales were most brisk last month in south Richmond Hill (N03), with an average 31 days. By comparison, houses were flying off the shelves in only 17 days as recently as March;

• Average prices in Markham-Thornhill (N01), Richmond Hill (N03, N04) averaged more than \$500,000

last month.

• While Newmarket is consistently the best value, with an \$382,078 average last month, Vaughan's half of Thornhill took a tumble, with 80 sales averaging only \$387,794. By comparison, March saw 112 sales averaging almost \$530,000 and the year-to-date average is more than \$480,000;

• Detached home sales sold for an average 101 per cent of list price in both central Markham (N11) and its half of Thornhill (N01);

• While sales have slowed, condo apartments continue to gain a foothold with more than 150 selling last month. While a detached house in Vaughan (N08) averages more than nearly \$640,000, the average condo cost \$298,993, and;

• The region's quietest, but priciest district, northeast Whitchurch-Stouffville (N13) has seen 96 properties change hands so far this year for an average \$749,917.

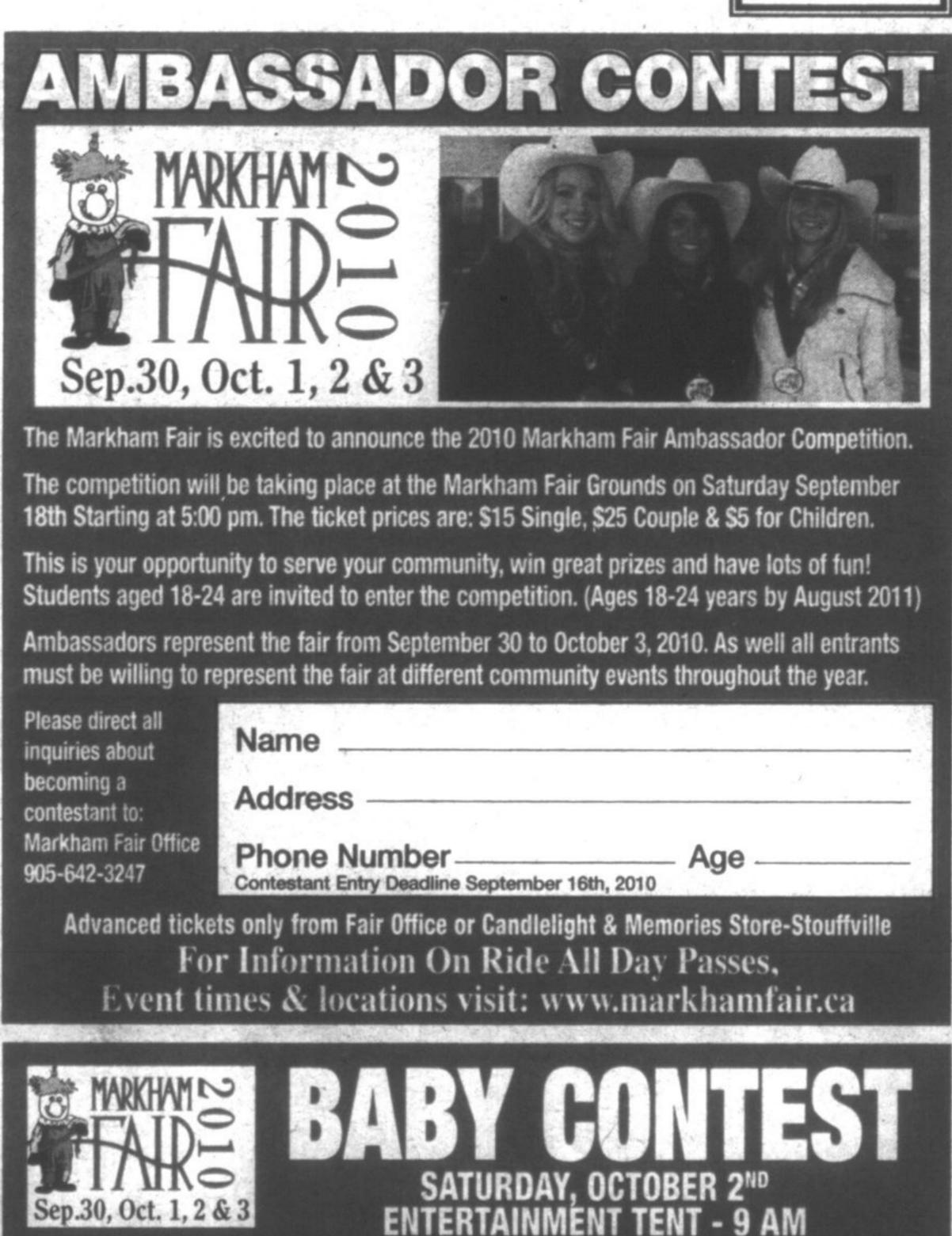
