We can't stop the fact we're getting older with every minute that ticks by on the clock. But what we can control is how we age physically.

In an effort to get older adults more mobile, the town's leisure services department is holding an Active Aging Week, during which time a variety of programs will be available for free.

"We're trying to remove that barrier because a fixed income is sometimes a barrier" to trying an activity, said Barb Armstrong, fitness supervisor for the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville.

TOWN PROGRAMS OPEN

Classes being offered for free between Sept. 20 and 26 include gentle fit, aquafit, cardio dance, walking with poles, seniors swim and Tai Chi.

"The winter is a tough time, so (it's) giving them ideas of what they can do," Ms Armstrong said. "If you don't use it, you lose it."

A free wellness seminar entitled Active Aging and Falls Prevention is scheduled for Sept. 21 at the Silver Jubilee Club (1 p.m.) and again at the Lebovic Leisure Centre (7 p.m.)

"The more you reduce your activity, the greater chance of you falling," Ms Armstrong said.
