

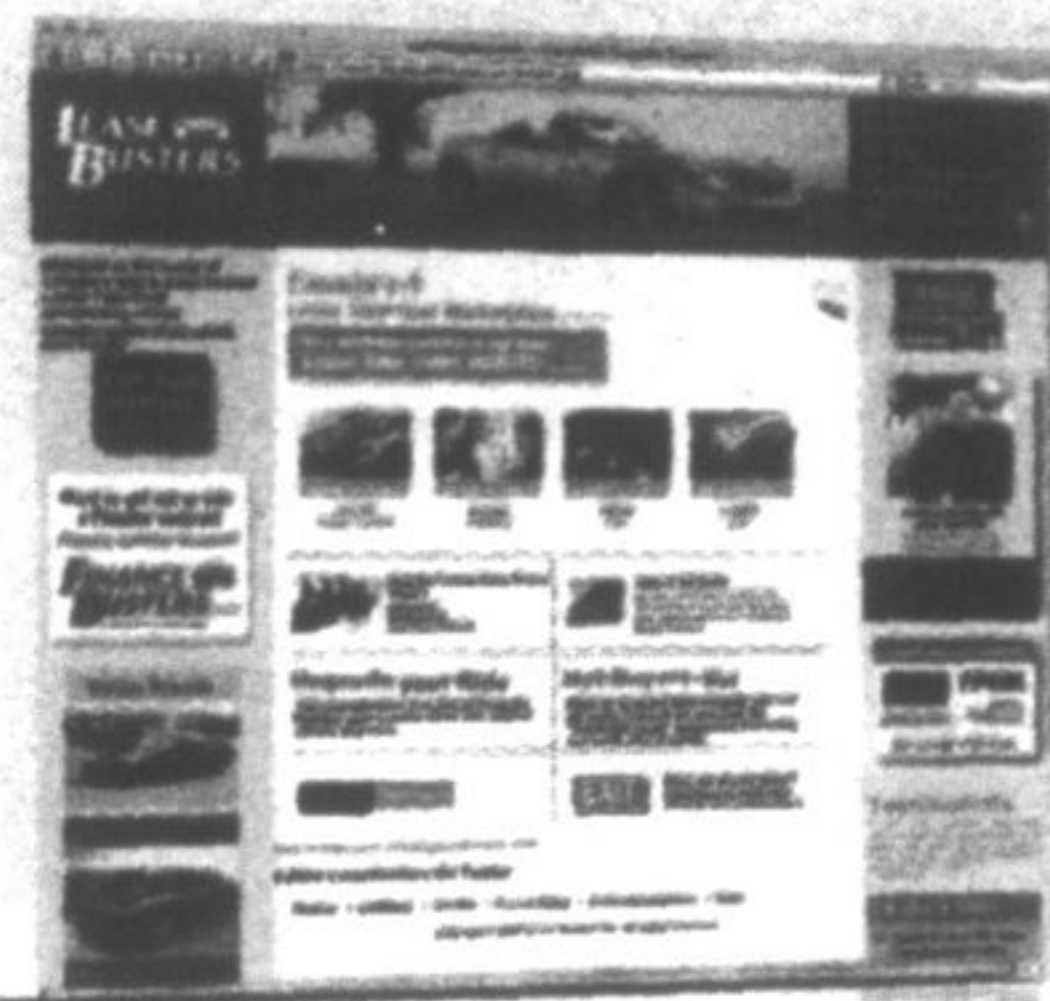

COMING UP: Friends sing Sunday

Concert series amps up for fourth season of song

Blues, pop and classical music will kick off the fourth season of Stouffville United Music's Sunday Concert on Church series this weekend.

Friends in Song will feature Courtney Fox, Heidi Wallis, A.J. deBoer, Brandon Wild, Lillian Wild, Georgia Aprile and Pat Wild.

"She's coming back specifically for this," said Cap Cowan, chairperson of the SUM committee of Ms Wild, the church's former music director who moved to Vineland over the summer.

Also performing will be Debra Archer. "She sings fantastic blues. She's really good," Mr. Cowan said. "It'll be quite an evening. It'll be a lot of fun."

With every new season comes change and this fall is no different for the SUM organizers.

'ELEVATE CONTENT'

"We'd like to elevate the content and grow a little bit," Mr. Cowan said.

Part of that growth includes hosting performances dedicated to one genre of music.

They experimented with this concept a little bit last season with a country night and a gospel night, both of which were received well, according to Mr. Cowan.

"We're going to continue experimenting," he said.

However, they won't go too far into left field.

"We try to protect the sanctity of the church. We won't ever be the Masonic Hall on Yonge Street," Mr. Cowan said. "The music is safe for (the) family. ... (It is) music that is reflective of the inner spirit ... a celebration of the positive human spirit."

The SUM concerts started four years ago as a way to showcase Stouffville United Church's great hall.

"The building was designed for amazing acoustics," he said.

The shows are free, however, a free-will offering is accepted.

"The free wills work enough; it helps carry the freight," Mr. Cowan said. "No performers are going to get rich doing our SUM concerts."

The concert starts at 7:30 p.m.
