

TRANSIT: GO adding to two-year-old station

More parking en route to Lincolnville

The Lincolnville GO Station is getting more parking, a new bus storage garage and crew centre.

An internal road into the station, at Tenth Line and Bethesda Road, will also be constructed.

Work on the public parking area's additional 410 spaces, which will be located east of the existing parking lot, started back in July and is expected to be completed next month. There will be 560 parking bays in total.

"GO is expanding parking at this station to improve the commuting experience for our customers and address the growing customer demand. A population growth in the surrounding York Region community has led to a boost in ridership at this station," said Vanessa Thomas, spokesperson for Metrolinx GO Transit.

Construction of the bus storage facility,

which will be able to house nine buses, the 4,000-square-foot crew centre and internal road extension is to begin within the next few days, according to Ms Thomas.

"We anticipate that the Lincolnville GO Station will remain fully operational during the construction of the new crew centre, bus storage facility and expanded internal road. There may be some impacts to the bus operations and GO customers during the construction period but these impacts will be minimized as much as possible with advance notices and appropriate signage for customers," according to Ms Thomas.

The station, which opened two years ago, is expected to be fully operational in October 2011.
