Musicians Carys Montgomery and Justin Kerswill will perform. The dinner will be catered by The Roving Chef.

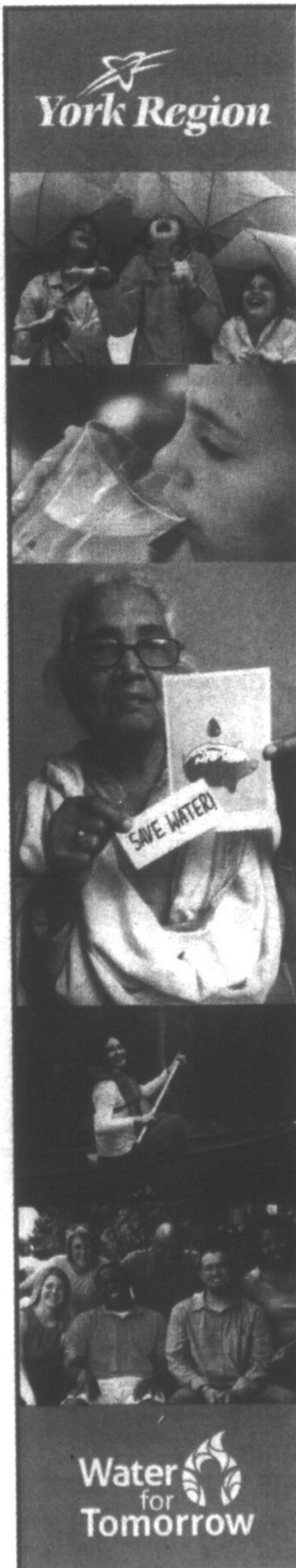

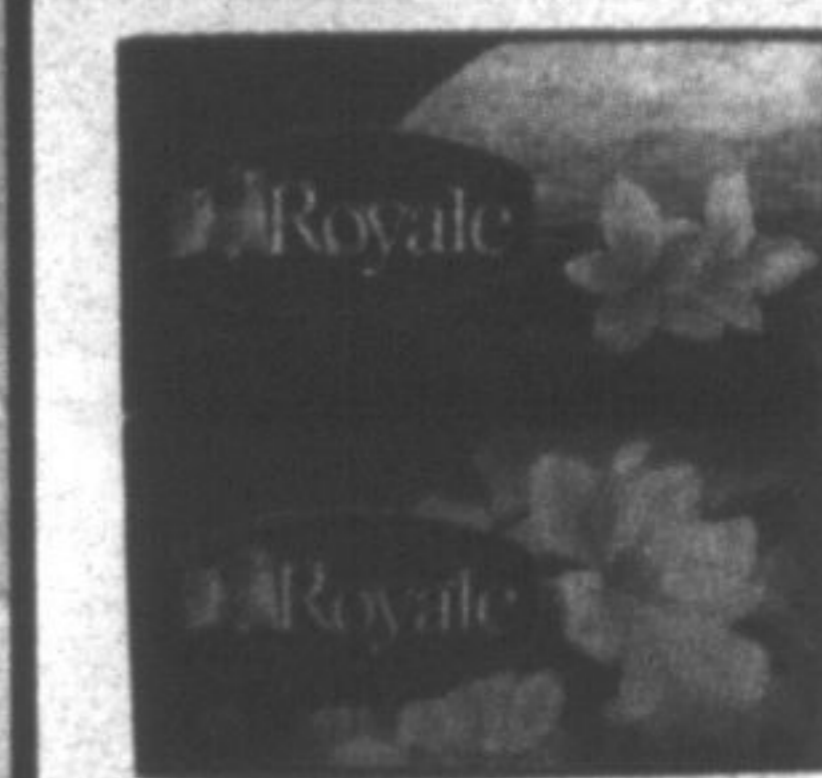

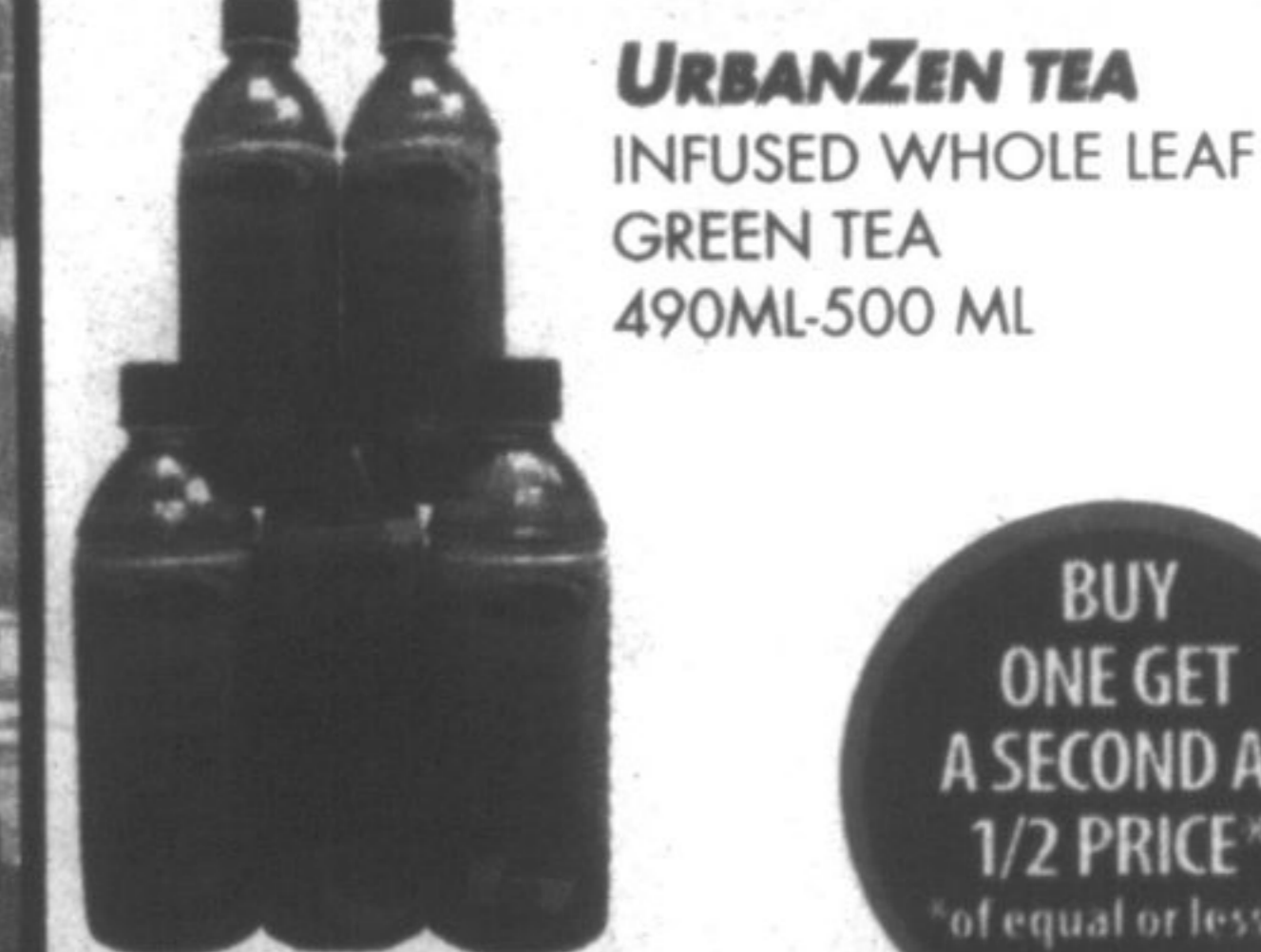
