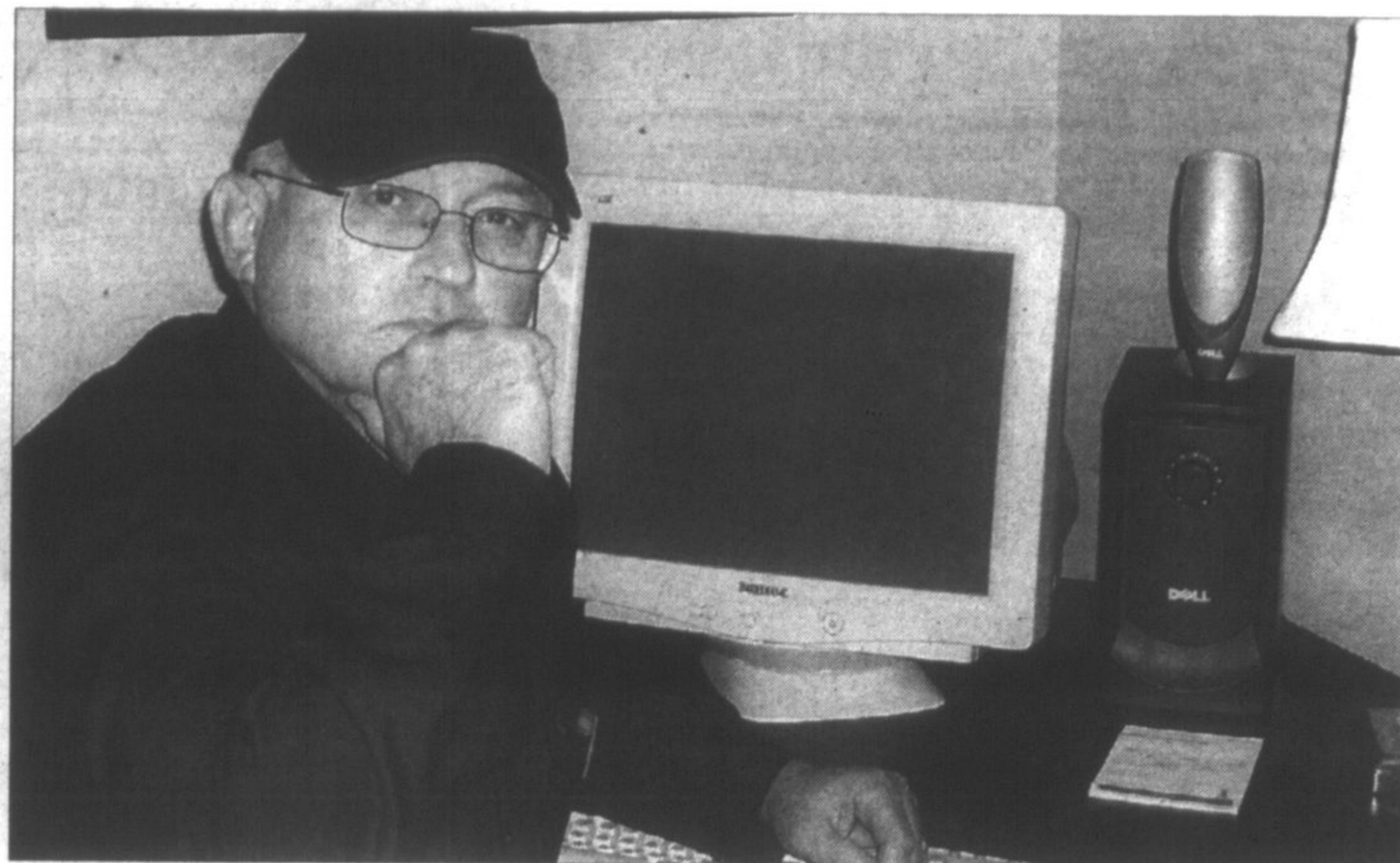

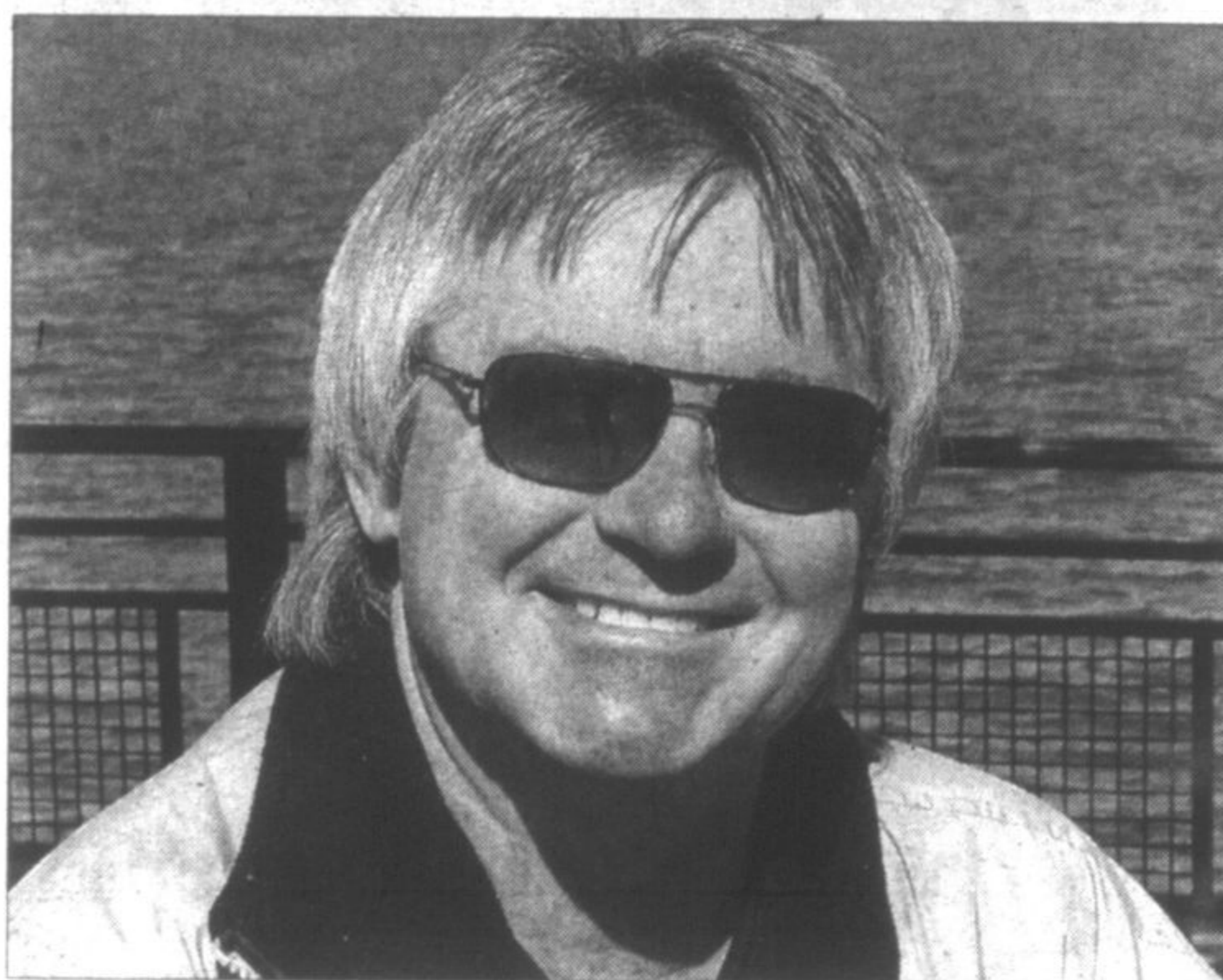

Fallen heroes honoured in song

Harold Hutchings was driving along the 401 when he was re-routed for a Highway of Heroes procession.

Watching the people pay tribute to a fallen hero they in all likelihood did not know, inspired the Stouffville resident to write the lyrics to Fallen Hero. Barry Haggarty, a Peterborough-based musician wrote the music and sang the song.

"It's a tribute song to our fallen soldiers and to the many brave and injured soldiers and their families," Mr. Hutchings said.

The song is now a part of a fund-raising campaign - Canadian Fallen Hero.

Money raised from the downloading of the song will go to the Military Families Fund, which assists military families faced with unforeseen and often immediate needs that are the result of the conditions of service.

"These people dedicate their lives so we can live ours without persecution," Mr. Hutchings said. "Everybody remembers them when a tragic thing happens. When it's over, they're forgotten about."

Mr. Hutchings hopes to raise \$100,000 for the organization.

This is not the first time Mr. Hutchings has written lyrics to raise money for an organization. A few years ago, he wrote In This House, which was performed by Marion Drexler to raise money for the Sick-Kids Foundation.

"I can't sing or play an instrument. I hear things in my head but just come up with words and ideas," Mr. Hutchings said.
