

Stouffville's Wise 'tricks' hometown Jr. A hockey team

The Newmarket Hurricanes appear to have the Stouffville Spirit's number.

For the fourth time in as many outings between the two clubs this season, the Hurricanes got the better part of the Spirit as they skated off with a 5-1 win in Ontario Junior Hockey League action Thursday.

Inflicting a good portion of the damage on the Spirit was Stouffville resident Jamie Wise, who recorded a hat trick.

Wise, the son of Ryerson University men's hockey coach Graham Wise, opened the scoring just prior to the midway point of the first period.

But the Spirit tied the game at the 12-minute mark on a goal by Trevor Carrick.

The Spirit resumes league play tomorrow when it hosts the Collingwood Blackhawks at the Stouffville Arena at 2:10 p.m.

That would be as close as the Spirit would get as the Hurricanes took the lead for good in the second period with a pair of unanswered goals, including Wise's second of the game. Wise played for the Peterborough Petes in the Ontario Hockey League last season.

The Hurricanes added two more goals in the third period.

Occupying second place in the North

Division and improving their record to 13 wins, four overtime wins, three losses and one shootout loss, the Hurricanes outshot the Spirit 31-23.

The loss by the Spirit (11-9), who are tied with the Huntsville Otters for third place in the North Division, dropped their record to 10 wins, one shootout win, six losses, two overtime losses and one shootout loss.

The Spirit resumes league play tomorrow when it hosts the Collingwood Blackhawks at the Stouffville Arena at 2:10 p.m.
