

Wise makes point in return to OHL

Stouffville's Jamie Wise was acquired by the Mississauga-St. Michael's Majors from the Peterborough Petes for an eighth round draft pick in the 2011 Ontario Hockey League draft Friday.

He had an assist and got in a fight when the Majors defeated the Petes 4-3 Sunday.

Wise, 19, had 11 points in 12 games with the Jr. A Newmarket Hurricanes this season, after two games with the Petes, who he played for last season.

The Majors, the top-ranked team in Canada, are hosting the 2011 Memorial Cup.

Wise is the son of Ryerson University men's hockey coach Graham Wise.

JR. A HOCKEY NOTEBOOK: Orangeville returns

Spirit can get revenge tonight

LAST WEEK: Friday: Stouffville Spirit 5 vs. Aurora Tigers 1. Sunday: Orangeville Flyers 3 vs. Stouffville 2. Spirit record: 13 wins, one overtime win, one shootout win, seven losses, one shootout loss, two overtime losses, 33 points. Fourth place in North Division.

GAME NOTES: Prior to the start of Sunday's game against the Orangeville Flyers, Spirit head coach Craig Donovan warned his team about their opponents - they compete hard. Apparently the Spirit didn't take Donovan's warning too seriously as they saw their fourgame winning streak snapped by the visiting Flyers 3-2. After a scoreless first period, the Spirit took a 2-0 lead within just over a twominute span on goals from Declan Gunovski and Andrew Doyle. But just past the midway mark of the third period, the Flyers stormed back with three unanswered goals to skate off with the two points. The Flyers outshot the Spirit 36-22. Among the 33 shots stopped by Spirit netminder Dalton McGrath were two penalty shots including one in the first period and one in the third.

The loss by the Spirit came on the heels of a 5-1 road win over the Aurora Tigers Friday. Trailing 1-0 after 20 minutes, the Spirit stormed back in the second period to take 'a 3-1 lead on a pair of goals from Gunovski, including one on a power play, and one from Chris Porter. The Spirit carried that momentum into the third period and capitalized on a couple of extra strength opportunities when Trevor Carrick and Kory Kennedy each scored once to round out the scoring. The Spirit outshot the Tigers 45-29.

INSIDER: The Spirit played Sunday's game

without the services of forward Billy Lovatsis, who sat out a one-game suspension after incurring an instigator penalty during Friday's game in Aurora. Rookie Mike Robinson remains one to two weeks away from returning to active duty as he's nursing a back injury. Apart from that, Donovan said his club is as healthy as they've been all season.

GENERALLY SPEAKING: "Our coaching staff watched Orangeville play and the one message I told our team was that they're a hard working team. We don't want to be outworked by them. In the first and third periods, they played with more energy than

Donovan was also quick to praise the work of Flyers' netminder Nick Gigone, who made his debut with the Flyers this season after a brief stint at Buffalo State University. The 20year-old from Fort Erie was especially good during the early going of the contest.

"We had our chances to score early but didn't bury our chances."

The Spirit is at the halfway mark of their regular-season schedule. Reflecting on their first half, Donovan was pleased with the progress made by his troops.

"On the whole I'm happy in terms of points," he said. "But having said that, there were at least four or five points that we should have got and they might come back to haunt us at the end of the year.

"But we had a front-end loaded schedule where we played a lot of the top teams in our division and in the West Division and I'm pretty pleased with how we've done.

"I just hope we can continue to show improvement in the second half of our schedule," he said.
